I would love to tell you this was totally altruistic on my part but I didn't love having a giant bag of apples in the middle of the kitchen. The pile of shoes is already enough of a tripping hazard. Plus, I remembered last year the bag of apples hung around until it began to smell... So I took the apples and was reminded of how much I have to be grateful for as it was another steady night feeding and connecting with folks downtown. All the apples went, as did several gallons of coffee, blessing bags made by the VBS kids, 160 burritos, and love.

To me it was just a bag of apples. Yet, our neighbors were so thankful.

Some churches view this merely as a budgeting exercise, others see it as a chance to stretch or grow in generosity. However, I purpose a different challenge. A letter from our Council President

Hello Parkside Lutheran members.

I'd like to share an update on the work of your church council, which has been developing plans to advance the mission and values of Parkside Lutheran.

The council – including newly elected leaders Carolyn Case (vice president), Sue Stapell (secretary) and myself (president) – recently established our priorities for the coming 12 months. I'll share those three priorities below, along with near-term actions we're taking to bring them to life.

Invitation to Ministry

This priority ties closely to our values of Proclaiming Grace and Cultivating Community. One of our most important goals is to expand our roster of ministries, and participation in those ministries, with particular emphasis on engaging youth and young families; you can expect to hear regular updates on how we're moving this forward. This goal is consistent with the strategic recommendations of the larger ELCA, underscoring the importance of building a thriving community that spans age groups.

Feeding and Nurturing Community

This priority is driven by our values of Practicing Hospitality, Cultivating Community, and Loving Boldly. Our existing ministries are thriving, thanks to members' commitment to the North Buffalo Food Pantry, Buffalo Burrito Project, spaghetti dinner, and brewing theology, to name a few.

Building on these ministries, we are expanding to include community meals (the first of which took place Sept. 11 and hosted about 40 community members) and a community garden – planned to launch in May 2026 – that will provide fresh produce for food pantry clients and create new volunteer opportunities for members and the wider community.

Building Inclusivity and Sustainability

This final goal has grown out of our values of Practicing Hospitality, Loving Boldly, and Cultivating Community. It's the reason we launched our Oct. 17 Meat Raffle, which aims to raise funds for an ADA-compliant bathroom, and why we've developed the healthy building fund as a means to manage ongoing building improvements and repairs proactively, rather than making one-off requests for emergency repairs.

As a tangible way to move these priorities forward, the council voted on Sept. 25 to allocate three equal shares of the \$42,000 in recently received Covid relief funds into these priorities. Specific funding decisions will be reviewed and approved by the finance committee and the full council.

I hope you find this update helpful; now, I'd like to close with an action item and a request.

The action item is that I'll be sharing more detail on these goals and our most recent activities in a discussion after the Oct. 19 service. Everyone is welcome to attend and give feedback at that time or directly to myself or any council member. The second is to request once again your support in the form of time and effort to help us continue on the journey of making Parkside Lutheran a thriving, welcoming community. As always, your contributions are welcome and appreciated.


Rev. Jeff Wilson
