#### **Medical Clinic Mission Project Volunteers**

November 22-23 will see an important mission come to Crestview. The Crestview Nazarene Church is sponsoring a Remote Area Medical mission that weekend. This is such a large project, they are relying on volunteers from sister churches so we will be supporting it. Because of the large numbers of people who need this service, volunteers are needed to help out. In fact, even though the event starts on Saturday morning, since it is first come first served, people start lining up as early as midnight on Friday night so volunteers will even be needed through the night. The event will be held at Crestview High School. I'm planning on supporting and being a part of this and I encourage my church family to help as well.

The event will be recognized at the Community Thanksgiving Worship Service on that Sunday night.

#### **Streaming Services**

I mentioned last month that we have been making some changes for 9:45. All of the equipment has arrived and is being installed. We hope all the new changes will be implemented by the time you read this (or soon).

I am so thankful for the donations which have made this upgrade possible. We are still in need of volunteers to help on a rotating basis with either the sound or the video at either the 9:45 service or the 11 AM service. If you are interested in learning more or in being trained, please speak to me or Warren Caruso.

#### **Stained Glass and Christmas**

The next auction will be in November and will conclude at the CommUNITY Dinner. This group will be more numerous and will feature more smaller pieces which may make excellent Christmas gifts. Photos will be posted on the church website and Facebook soon.

We will have a larger auction with bigger pieces in March. There are some amazing pieces coming!

Some may be thinking.... I wish I could have at least something from this 100 year old stained glass, and we want to make that happen. In the past, we have given out wooden ornaments at the Christmas Eve service. This year, our goal is to will give out an ornament to every person who attends. These will be made of epoxy and will have small stained glass pieces in them. These will be free so that all may share in this amazing project.

As of this writing, the first two auctions have raised over \$7,000, and the money has gone to missions and to worship technology. The proceeds for the November auction will go to the Benevolence Fund. The proceeds for the March auction will go to debt reduction.

#### FINANCIAL INSIGHTS:

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." -1 Thessalonians 5:18

As you gather around the table this month, consider ways to cultivate gratitude through your finances:

- Count your blessings, not just your bills. Make a family list of three things you're thankful for this year one spiritual, one relational, and one financial. Gratitude changes perspective.

- If you are over age 70.5, you can use a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) strategy to satisfy your Required Minimum Distributions. QCDs are the ONLY way to get money out of an IRA completely TAX FREE.


