Reflection

Echo Chamber

The question is:

Am I humble?

This begs the question:

What is humility?

Believe it or not, St. Benedict (480-547) in his Rule -Chapter 7 – teaches that humility is a 12-step process:

He places emphasis on listening to God and others ('obedience'), transparency in one's life, and not talking too much – and certainly not talking badly about others.

St. Thomas Aquinas (1225–1274) says humility is really a subset of the cardinal virtue of temperance (harmony):

In pursuing difficult and challenging things, we need humility because it helps moderate our desires, and we need enterprise to encourage us against hopelessness.

Humility means we won't get ahead of ourselves and humility helps us know the limit of our abilities (ST, Q. 161).

All this is helpful. It puts humility in the context of relationship with God, others and self.

But of course, we face an enemy. The primordial temptation is perennial:

You will be just like God (Genesis 3).

Satan deceives us.

The pharisee has got the same issue:

Self-enclosed, living in his own echo chamber.

Not the tax-collector. He knows his limits:

God, be merciful to me, a sinner (Luke 18).

If we pray like this, we're humble.

Amen.
