KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY

St. John's will again be participating in the Kairos Prison Ministry at the Foothills Maximum Security Correctional Institution in Morganton, NC. This is the 28th Weekend for Kairos scheduled for November 6-9, 2025. The team has been meeting and preparing for the weekend. You, too, can participate in this ministry. You can go into the institution as part of God's team through your donations of prayers and money, which power the light of Christ that shines into the darkness. It cost \$5 to sponsor a meal, or \$30 to sponsor an entire table, or \$210 to sponsor an entire meal A meal card with your first name will be presented to each participant you sponsor. You can also donate online at kairosfcinc.org. When it says "Select the council....." scroll down and select "Foothills CI" and complete information. Prayer sign-up sheets will be placed in each Adult Sunday School Class, on the table in the Narthex, and in the Choir Room. Checks should be made out to "Kairos of NC". In the memo block write "Foothills CI". The checks can be given to Gerald Cline or Jim Hayes, or put in the offering plate. All donations are tax deductible and you will receive a letter from Kairos acknowledging your contribution. All who sign up for prayer will have their names placed on a Prayer Wheel each day and displayed for the participants to view.

On one weekend, a participant was looking at the Prayer Wheels for Thursday – Saturday. A team member said, "That's a lot of prayers isn't it". The participant said, "Yea, there are 869 people praying for us". He had counted every name!! It is a blessing to see the work of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of these young men ALL OF US TOGETHER, WITH CHRIST, MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³² It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. ³³ But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴ No longer shall they teach one another or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD, for I will forgive their iniquity and remember their sin no more.

A reading from Romans.


¹⁹ Now we know that, whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For no human will be justified before him by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹ But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed and is attested by the Law and the Prophets, ²² the righteousness of God through the faith of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³ since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴ they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶ it was to demonstrate at the present time his own righteousness, so that he is righteous and he justifies the one who has the faith of Jesus.

²⁷ Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. Through what kind of law? That of works? No, rather through the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

³¹ Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples, ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." ³³ They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?"

³⁴Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵ The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. ³⁶ So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed."




