

Church Council News

Comox Valley Weather Forecast for January 2026: Temperature -3C° · Wind SE 35 km/hr · Heavy blowing snow

There are over 200 people in the Comox Valley experiencing homelessness and 20% of them are seniors. Can you imagine navigating winter weather without a home? **On Sunday, November 16th, at 11:45pm** after coffee time, there will be an information session in the church hall to explore the possibility of opening an **Extreme Weather Response Shelter (EWR)** at Comox United Church.

Late in 2023, the need for an EWR in Comox was identified and tentative discussions in the Church Council commenced in September of 2024.

So what is an Extreme Weather Response Shelter?

If current or forecast weather conditions reach a certain pre-defined threshold, the regional district will declare an EWR. EWR Shelters then open between specified hours (often 7pm to 7am OR 8pm to 8am).

A third-party agency that has extensive experience running shelters both in the lower mainland and on the island would run the shelter at Comox United. There is a predetermined maximum number of clients allowed (in our case probably 10). When that number is reached, the doors will be closed and no further clients would be admitted.

The Comox United Council invites us to explore together the possibility of an EWR Shelter that provides a substance-free space and is run as a pilot project for one season.

This Monday at Comox United at 7pm we have a special opportunity to meet one of Canada's leading voices of support for Palestinians. **Rabbi David Mivasair** will speak on "Hope and Despair: How Direct Aid Helps Gazan Families Survive". Rabbi David has lived in Israel for four years and has returned twice to assist in the West Bank through the Center for Jewish Nonviolence. He embodies what it means to speak difficult truths so that the suffering of others, Palestinians in this case, is not made invisible.

- This week's theme week will be "Peace and Remembrance"



- give money through the Minister's Discretionary Fund for gift cards (we encourage giving this way if you would like to help with larger clothing items, like coats, pants, and shoes)

Pacific Mountain Justice Ministry presents "What the Hell?"

On-line discussion series on Wednesday at 6⁰⁰ pm



In "What the Hell?", we will come together for thoughtful engagement on how bad theology affects us all. The 2SLGBTQIAP+ community has long been menaced with images and threats of hell, and a certainty that queer folks will end up there if they do not renounce the way that God lovingly created them. But what is hell? What were/are we told about hell in our churches and faith communities? How does this affect images in wider society and how society is in relationship with both 2SLGBTQIAP+ people, the church and hell?

In this series we will explore themes from Queer Theology, the Affirming Ministry movement, and Liberation Theology. By exploring these themes, we may begin to create a deeper and broader understanding of what Queer theology is, of how it enriches the life of the church and the theology of the United Church, and of the expansive connections Queer Theology shares with struggles for rights and equality in our everyday lives; not just for queer people, but for everyone.

This series is led via zoom by Kendra Mitchell-Foster, Regional Minister, and Pam Rocker of Affirming Connections. We will also welcome special guest Rev. Mark Tremblay!
