FCC Life Group Discussion Notes Based on the "God is Able" Series of Matthew Rogers 10-26-2025

Opening Prayer

Group Member: Please lead us in prayer.

Heavenly Father, we thank You for Your endless provision and love. Open our hearts to Your Word and the promises You've made to us. Guide our discussion, help us grow in faith, and show us how to live generously for Your Kingdom. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Ice Breaker

Share a time when you experienced God's provision in an unexpected way. It could be financial, emotional, or spiritual. How did it impact your trust in Him?

Key Scripture

Group Member: Please read Ephesians 3:20 (NIV) aloud.

Ephesians 3:20 (NIV): Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us.

Sermon Summary

The sermon "God Is Able" reminds us that while human resources like oil, time, or money are limited, God's resources are infinite. Through scriptures like **2 Corinthians 9:6-11**, we learn that God promises to meet all our needs, provide more to share generously, and bless us richly when we give in faith. This ties to FCC's "God Is Able" initiative, encouraging us to trust God's economy over the world's and give sacrificially to expand His Kingdom.

Discussion Points

Point 1: God Promises to Meet All Our Needs

Group Member: Please read 2 Corinthians 9:8 (CSB).

2 Corinthians 9:8 (CSB): And God is able to make every grace overflow to you, so that in every way, always having everything you need, you may excel in every good work.

Summary: God assures us that when we give generously, He will provide everything we need. This promise challenges us to trust Him as the source of all resources, not our own efforts. It's a call to live by faith, knowing God's provision never runs dry, unlike human economies.

Questions:

- 1. How does viewing God as the source of all resources change your perspective on giving or financial decisions?
- 2. What's one area in your life where you struggle to trust God's provision, and how can this group pray for you?

Point 2: God Supplies More to Share Generously

Group Member: Please read 2 Corinthians 9:11 (CSB).

2 Corinthians 9:11 (CSB): You will be enriched in every way for all generosity, which produces thanksgiving to God through us.

Summary: God doesn't enrich us to hoard wealth but to be channels of generosity. Like broadband internet compared to a straw, God wants us to be "broadband givers," letting His resources flow through us to bless others. This aligns with FCC's Follow-Connect-Contribute pathway, where giving fuels Kingdom work.

Questions:

- 1. What does being a "broadband giver" look like in your daily life or through the "God Is Able" initiative?
- 2. How have you seen generosity (yours or others') lead to thanksgiving or impact for God's Kingdom?

Point 3: Generosity Brings Greater Blessings

Group Member: Please read Acts 20:35 (NIV).

Acts 20:35 (NIV): In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'

Summary: Jesus teaches that giving brings a greater blessing than receiving. This challenges our reliance on the world's economy and invites us to live by faith in God's economy. At FCC, this means giving cheerfully to initiatives like "God Is Able," trusting God will multiply our impact and bless us spiritually.

Questions:

- 1. Why do you think giving can be more blessed than receiving, and have you experienced this?
- 2. How can giving sacrificially to FCC's vision stretch your faith and deepen your connection to God's work?

Wrap-Up

God's promises in **2 Corinthians 9:6-11** assure us that He is able to provide beyond our imagination. As we consider our role in FCC's "God Is Able" initiative, let's trust Him to meet our needs, supply more to share, and bless us through generous giving. How can we support each other in taking steps of faith this week?

Challenge

This week, pray daily about your "God Is Able" commitment. Ask God to show you how to give cheerfully and trust His provision. Take one practical step toward generosity—whether it's giving time, resources, or encouragement—and share your experience with the group next week.
