Luke 17:11-19 Small Group Discussion Guide

Opening

- Welcome each person by name
- Invite each person to share how they are feeling "today"
- Work hard to truly listen to each person (but don't try to fix anyone!)
- Invite one person to pray for the Holy Spirit to illumine your hearts, minds, and bend your wills to follow the Lord as a result of reading the Word

Reading

- Invite one person to read aloud Luke 17:11-19
- Spend 2 minutes in silence to think about the passage (have a time-keeper!)
- Invite a different person to read aloud Luke 17:11-19 for a second reading

Discussion

Pick any of the following questions: don't feel you need to get through everything, but do try to deepen relationships with those in your group: maybe think of other questions, too

- 1. Luke, the beloved physician (Colossian 4:14), includes many miracles in his gospel. Describe this particular one. Why does he not focus on the medical or anatomical details of this specific miracle?
- 2. If all ten lepers were healed, then why did only one return (v.15)? What significance might this have for the point that Luke is trying to make in this episode?
- 3. Lepers were excluded from Jewish communities and blocked from participation in worship (Leviticus 13-14). Which groups are stigmatized today in our community and why? How might we at Restoration Fellowship welcome such groups rather than ignore them or ostracize them?
- 4. The leper "fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks" (v.16). What might be the equivalent for you today to nurture your personal relationship with Jesus? Describe a current spiritual practice that helps you increase intimacy with Jesus Christ.
- 5. Consider any questions you had about the passage

Prayer

- 15 minutes before you end the meeting invite people to share a prayer request
- Ask clarifying questions to ensure you understand what the requests are
- Provide some closing prayer (perhaps the Lord's Prayer together?)
- Thank the group
