
The Anglican Church of St. John the Divine The 20th Sunday after Pentecost October 26, 2025 Stewardship



Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.





Gluten free wafers for communion are available. Please request them from the person who is distributing the bread.
