An Update from Mission Lexington:

As the needs of the community have grown, Mission Lexington's present location does not provide adequate space for all that is needed.

Mission Lexington's new location will be off North Lake Drive, right next to Pilgrim Lutheran Church.

The new facility will be a **two-story**, **25,000-square-foot building** with all of their services under one roof.

- Downstairs will house our direct services for families in crisis and the Mission Store.
 - **Upstairs** will include our administrative offices and a large community room for collaboration, education, and outreach.

This new space will allow them to:

- Offer **greater privacy** so people feel safe sharing their needs.
- Provide **more resources** to help families get back on their feet.
- Create a **welcoming space** where everyone feels seen, valued, and loved.

This is more than just a building; it's a **promise** that Mission Lexington will continue to stand beside our neighbors in need - here to serve, strengthen, and support the people who call Lexington County home.

Jesus said in Matthew 25:35, "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger, and you welcomed me in." That's what this ministry is all about. Every bag of groceries, every bill that gets paid, every prayer offered in encouragement, it's all done in service to Christ.


