This All Saints' Sunday, we will remember thirty beloved members of Calvary who have entered the Church Triumphant since last year. As each name is spoken aloud, a candle will be lit: a visible flame reminding us that Christ's light continues to shine through their witness.

Grief is heavy. It slows time and changes us. Yet, through the mystery of faith, grief can open us more fully to God, to one another, and to the deeper truth that love endures beyond all endings. As the Apostle Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 4:13, "We do not grieve as those who have no hope." We grieve because we have loved, and love leaves a mark that never fails.

This November, we will consider a 3-part sermon series entitled, "Mourning to Morning: Loss, Grief, and the Hope of Christ." This series will help us to walk together through the sacred rhythm of Christian grieving. Each week will help us name our losses and bear one another's burdens. We will discover again that comfort is not the absence of pain but the presence of God with us in our suffering.



The Missions Committee is pleased to provide Angel presents to several organizations this Christmas Season. The gifts provided will benefit the following:

<u>Calvary Kids Child Care Center</u> is a nonprofit Christian childcare center that strives for a family-like environment. Calvary Kids serves children ages 6 weeks to 5 years with a Before and After School Program as well as a School Age Summer Camp.

Camp Penn is one of three camps operated by the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church. It provides seasonal retreats in the months of April, May, August, September and October. Weekly summer camps in June, July and August are available for children ages 6 through 18 which are set in a Christian environment with a variety of themes and events. Since 1946, Camp Penn has been providing relevant and relational Christian, educational, non-profit and volunteer programs.

Ecumenical Retirement Community located in Paxtang, is a not-for-profit retirement community designed to provide affordable retirement living. For over 25 years, it has been offering quality care with different lifestyles such as Independent Living, Personal Care and Memory Support. Their mission is to provide an affordable retirement community of diversity and autonomy, where empowered residents of different religions, cultures and races live together to make a difference inside and outside of the community.

The Harrisburg Area Police Athletic League (HAPAL) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serving children ages 5 to 17 in the Harrisburg Area through mentoring, sports and educational programs. We empower them to reach their full potential while building positive connections between children, law enforcement, and the community. We have revitalized the baseball field, community park, and youth center located at 100 Elmwood Drive in Harrisburg. We are able to offer programming to the children of Lower Paxton. Harrisburg and surrounding areas. We currently offer spring and fall baseball, basketball at EH Phillips Elementary, craft and cooking class at our Youth Center. In partnership with more than 75 law enforcement officers, HAPAL hosts the Shop with a Cop program at Walmart each December, which invites 120 at-risk children from our area allowing them to select gifts, often essential items, for their families. Our mission is simple but powerful: to inspire, support and guide the children of our communities, helping them build brighter futures, while knowing they are never alone.

Penn National Race Track Chaplaincy Although most do not realize it, on the backside of a racehorse track there is a community of people that work and even live at the track. This community is made up of people that come from all walks of life but are brought together because of their love of horses and a passion for the sport. The main purpose of their job is to care for the horses with incredible devotion and love so the horses can run their best race. But who will care for the people in this unique community? Who will lift them up with compassion in a time of need. and also be their biggest supporter in times of happiness? Who is the spiritual backbone of this community? The answer may surprise you - it's the track chaplain. Through the Penn National Race Track Chaplaincy faith, friends and fellowship is provided.

Silence of Mary is located in Lemoyne serves the mentally ill, the terminally ill, expectant mothers, babies, children, students who need tutoring, teenagers and adults in crisis, the elderly, the poor, the homeless, the disadvantaged, refugees and immigrants. In the past they have provided shelter and tutoring to adults, teens and youngsters. Now they have been tasked with other urgent objectives such as food, hygiene items, clothing, help with housing, local schools' backpack programs, math tutoring, and other necessities.




