

Rectors Corner Yesterday, the Church began the great Feast of

All Saints. "Saint" means "holy one". It's not that we are holy on our own merits – not at all. We are considered as holy ones only because of what God has done for us through His Son, Jesus Christ. It is Christ's precious Blood that has cleansed us.

The Feast of All Saints reminds us that we are not alone. The Scripture says that we are "compassed about with a great cloud of witnesses". (Hebrews 12.1) We are surrounded by the people of God who have departed this world, but who are alive in Christ. This should give us comfort and hope. We are not alone. With them, we have been adopted into the family of God and made members of Christ. We have received an inheritance of the Kingdom of Heaven – imagine that!

And so there is this opportunity very year, from November 1st to 8th, to remember the faithful departed – all the saints. Among them we may give thanks for our own loved ones who have been examples to us in the Faith and pointed us to the Lord Jesus Christ.
