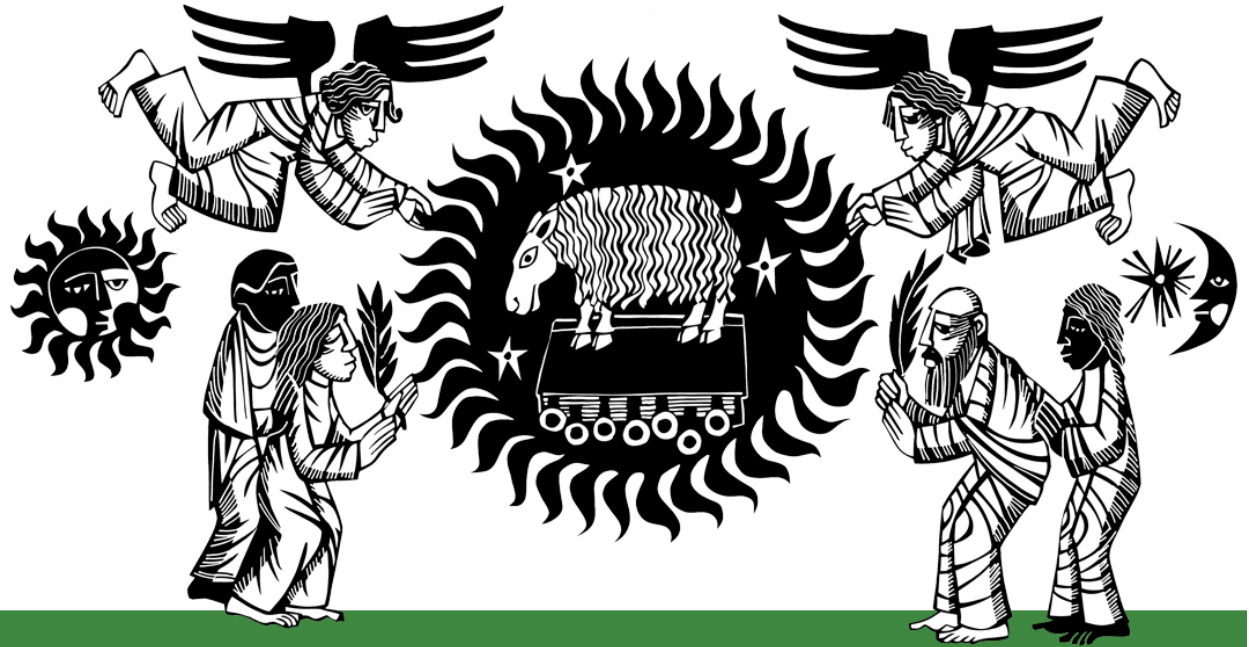

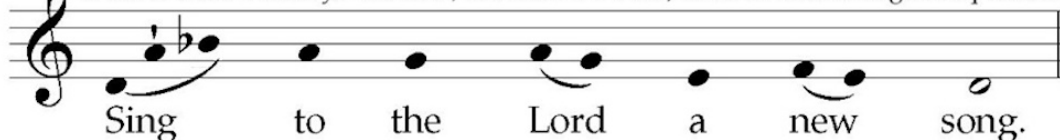

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

Dean The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsors I present Ali, Arielle, Masoumeh, Parker and Zhila to receive the sacrament of baptism.

When all have been presented the Dean asks the parents/sponsors:

Dean Do you desire to be baptized?

Answer I do.

Prnts./Spons. I present Henrique to receive the sacrament of baptism.

When all have been presented the Dean asks the parents/sponsors:

Dean Will you be responsible for seeing that this child
you present is nurtured in the faith and life
of the Christian community?

Answer I will,
with God's help.

Dean Will you by your prayers and witness help this child
to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Answer I will,
with God's help.

Then the Dean asks the candidates/parents/sponsors:

Dean Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of
wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Dean Do you renounce the evil powers of this world
which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Dean Do you renounce all sinful desires that
draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

<i>Dean</i>	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.
<i>Dean</i>	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.
<i>Dean</i>	Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?	<i>Answer</i>	I do.

After the candidates have been presented, the Dean addresses the congregation.

Dean Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Ali, Arielle, Henrique, Masoumeh, Parker and Zhila in their life in Christ?

All We will.

Prayers for the Candidates

Dean Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the sacrament of new birth.

Deacon Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Open their hearts to your grace and truth. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Send them into the world in witness to your love. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

Deacon Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Celebration of Baptism

The Thanksgiving over the Water

The Dean blesses the water.

Dean The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Dean Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Dean We give you thanks, almighty God and Father,
for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Dean We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea,
you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.

Dean We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Dean We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with its gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood. **Blessed be God for ever.**

Dean We give you thanks for you have called them to new life through the waters of baptism. Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom. We give you praise and honour and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

All **Blessed are you, our strength and song, and our salvation.**

Dean Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

Dean Do you believe in God the Father?

All **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Dean Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Dean Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Dean Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? **I will, with God's help.**

Dean Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? **I will, with God's help.**

Dean Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All **I will, with God's help.**

Dean Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All **I will, with God's help.**

Dean Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being? **I will, with God's help.**

Dean Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth? **I will, with God's help.**

The Baptism

The candidate is presented to the Dean.

Dean Ali, Arielle, Henrique, Masoumeh, Parker and Zhila I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Using chrism, the Dean makes the sign of the cross on the forehead, saying:

Dean I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Dean prays over the newly baptized.

Dean Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

The Giving of the Light

The Dean then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:

Dean Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

When the newly baptized has received a candle, the people say:

All Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Dean Let us welcome the newly baptized. We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

To receive the consecrated Bread, approach the altar and extend your hands to the minister with palms open. To receive the consecrated Wine, carefully guide the chalice to your lips. For public health, please do not dip the Bread into the Wine. If you do not wish to partake of the common cup, know that you receive the full efficacy of communion with only the Bread. If you do not wish to receive communion, you are invited to receive a blessing by approaching the altar and crossing your arms over your chest. You may also remain in your seat as you feel comfortable. If you are interested in learning about baptism, please contact a member of our clergy. During communion, Healing Prayer is offered for all people in the west alcove. Please respect the confidentiality of the people praying by not entering the alcove during prayer time.

About the Eucharistic Prayer

Today's Eucharistic Prayer is adapted from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada's *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (Prayer III). This text reflects the full communion agreement between the Anglican Church of Canada and the ELCIC, established through the Waterloo Declaration (2001), which recognizes a shared Eucharistic life and mutual recognition of ministry.

The prayer emphasizes the communion of saints, celebrating the unity of God's people on earth and in heaven, and giving thanks for those who have faithfully gone before us. It also affirms the hope of resurrection and the joy of the heavenly banquet, central themes of the Feast of All Saints.

By participating in this prayer, the congregation joins not only with the worshiping community gathered here, but also with the whole Church across time and space, recognizing that the Eucharist is both a present and a timeless act of God's grace.
