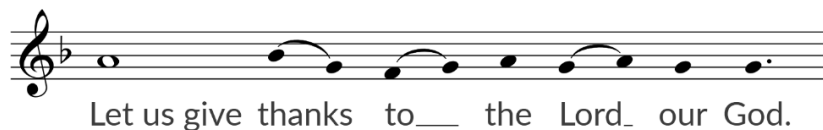
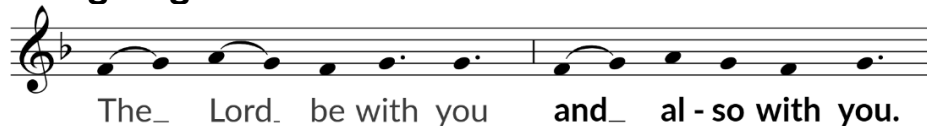

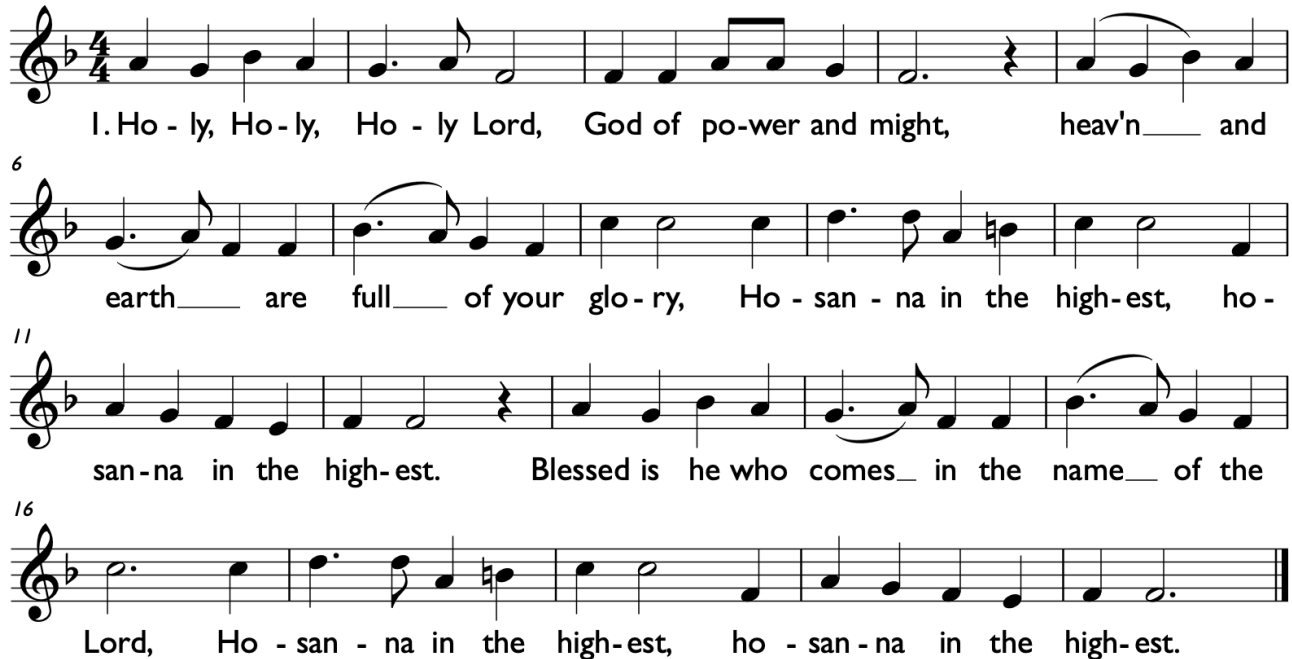

Notes for the Postlude:

Johannes Brahms – Clarinet Trio in A minor, Op. 114

III. Andante grazioso

Composed in 1891, Brahms's Clarinet Trio in A minor marks the beginning of the composer's remarkable "late clarinet works," inspired by the artistry of Richard Mühlfeld, principal clarinetist of the Meiningen Orchestra. At this stage of his life, Brahms had already declared his intention to retire from composing, yet Mühlfeld's expressive playing rekindled his creative spirit, resulting in some of his most intimate and iconic chamber music.

The Trio as a whole blends warmth and introspection, its dark-hued sonorities uniting clarinet, cello, and piano in a seamless dialogue of equals. The third movement, *Andante grazioso*, serves as a lyrical interlude between the work's more turbulent outer movements. It is graceful and songlike, with the clarinet's tender melody floating above a gently lilting accompaniment. Beneath its poised elegance, however, lies the wistful melancholy that characterizes so much of Brahms's late music—a delicate balance of serenity and nostalgia.
