"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. 6:22" Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. 6:23 Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

6:24 "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. 6:25 "Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. All Saints Sunday Devotional

Reflection on Luke 6:20–31

Inspired by the insights of Dallas Willard

On this All Saints Sunday, we remember those who have gone before us—ordinary people made radiant by grace. In Luke’s telling of the Beatitudes, Jesus blesses not the powerful or the privileged, but those the world forgets: the poor, the hungry, the weeping, the despised. Dallas Willard reminds us that these blessings are not commands to “be poor” or “be sad,” but vivid announcements that God’s kingdom is now open to everyone—even and especially those who seem farthest from blessing.

The saints we honor today were not perfect. They were people who discovered that the life of the Kingdom is available in the midst of ordinary weakness. They trusted that God’s transforming love meets us right where we are, and then calls us to live differently—to love our enemies, to bless those who curse us, to do good even when it costs us something.

To follow Christ in this way is to live as saints—not by achievement, but by grace. We join that great cloud of witnesses when we, too, believe that the world’s “unblessed” are blessed in God’s eyes, and that His kingdom is already breaking in through humble acts of love.

Prayer:

Lord, thank You for the saints who have shown us what Your love looks like in real life. Help us to live as citizens of Your upside-down Kingdom—poor in spirit, rich in mercy, and radiant with grace. Amen.
