

THE GOOD NEWS

Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. - Matthew 5:4

In the 2015 Pixar movie Inside Out, a young girl named Riley wrestles with her emotions, represented by a team of characters inside her head—Anger, Fear, Disgust, Sadness, and Joy. Each of them jockeys for control of the dashboard that is Riley's personality, wanting to respond to everything she experiences from their own perspective. You can imagine that always responding in anger is as ineffective as always responding in joy. Figuring out the balance between these aspects of herself is a real challenge for Riley as she navigates the roller coaster of moving from Minnesota to San Francisco with her family.

Riley matures as the team of emotions realize that there is value in all of them, that they have to work together, and that some of the most essential experiences are the most complex. Moments of great joy are tinged with sadness, as Riley remembers a pond hockey game—a fun day, but with friends she misses a lot. As she grows, she learns to accept this reality—and so do we. In our own lives, some of our most treasured memories are with people we can no longer reach out and touch, either because they live on the other side of the country or because they have passed on into eternal life with God.

This time of year offers us the bittersweet opportunity to remember all sorts of warm times together with our loved ones, and to notice how we carry them with us in the present and into the future. We'll start with All Saints Sunday on November 2nd, remembering all those we have loved who have died. Some people find this day mostly sad, while others find this day mostly joyful, and still others find it a combination of the two. I preached a few weeks about the nature of healing, and how in our real-life experience, it is never just one thing: gratitude and grief are partners.

As we move through the holiday season of November and December, you are likely to feel this in stark relief. The traditions that you grew up with are shaped differently decades later. Even with her recipes, nobody quite makes grandma's pies exactly like she did. Conversely, there are new generations to teach the recipes to, or new neighbors to see the holiday lights with, or new traditions to imagine altogether.

In these darkly divisive times in our country, most of our families and friends are finding it harder to gather around the same tables. Maybe your family, like mine, doesn't have one big Thanksgiving celebration anymore, and hasn't for several years. Or, if you are still planning to gather with the same people you always do, you're worried about how the conversation will go, knowing how many differences of opinion there are in that crowd. You wish that it could be like it once was. I hear your gratitude and your grief.

Please know that I am holding all of you and your families and friends and neighbors in my prayers. If there are particular worries you have about gathering (or not gathering, as the case may be) in the coming weeks, please do two things: share that with me, so that I can better pray for you, and share that with God. Remember that Jesus tells us to hand over our anxieties to him, that he will carry our heavy burdens. Remember that God heals the brokenhearted and binds up our wounds.

Our community is, as we have celebrated in the last several weeks, a chorus of generosity. This generosity extends to our generosity of spirit, where all of you are called to share in one another's joys and sorrows, in this and every season. Your feelings in this season of gratitude and grief do not need to leave you feeling isolated or unseen. Continue to join your voices together, with all the saints.



A sheet with gift suggestions will also be available in the narthex. Gifts are due November 23rd. LOOK FOR THE INTERFAITH GIFT BIN. This is a new and very fair way for Interfaith to distribute gifts. We have always been very generous with our designated families, but many others received much less. This will enable all families to receive a more equal amount. Last year 700 clients received holiday gifts, but this plan will provide gifts for many more.
- If you prefer to give gift cards, each adult will receive a \$25 WalMart gift card for groceries, cleaning supplies, or a little holiday sparkle. Additional gift cards of any kind or denomination are also welcome for case managers or clients to use for gift purchases of their choice.
- If you would like to help sort, wrap, or help families shop in the "Winterfaith" Shopping Mall on Friday, December 12th (shifts are between 3-7pm) or Saturday, December 13th (shifts are between 10am-3pm), we can organize groups to carpool, or you can schedule your own time. 
