Second Lesson 1 Corinthians 15.50-58

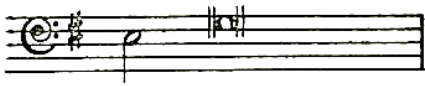
I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth:
