SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

Sermon: "Worship & Wealth: Reverence & Contentment" Series: "Meaning: Exploring Faith & Doubt" November 2, 2025 Texts: Ecclesiastes 5:1-7 & 6:1-12 Dave Sattler NSAC Sub-texts: Deuteronomy 6:4, Psalm 5:11, Psalm 46:1/10, Matthew 5:37

I. Introduction & Review Questions:

- What aspects of "life under the sun" does the writer of Ecclesiastes question? And, how does this sit with you? Discuss.
- Identify ways in which verses in Ecclesiastes have impact mainstream culture. Think The Byrds, Shakespeare, etc.
- How might God use Ecclesiastes to help us process doubts and losses or give voice to our frustrations about life's injustices?
- How might God use Ecclesiastes to help our faith to grow or bring us square with God's transcendence?

II. READ: Ecclesiastes 5:1-7: On Worship

III. Questions on Ecclesiastes 5:1-7

- 1. Discuss instructions the Teacher offers on worship in church.
- 2. Why do you go to church?
- 3. What posture should we come to church with? Pastor Dave said, "we ought to adopt a posture of being ready to <u>listen</u> to God." Discuss.
- 4. Talk about what it means to "make a vow and keep it" and why that might be difficult. Read Matthew 5:37.
- 5. When it comes to matters of faith, how can we be honest about where we're at, rather than pretend? What are the risks/benefits of not faking or pretending? Discuss.
- 6. What does it mean to have reverence in worship and to "fear God?" Discuss how God is imminent (accessible to us like a friend) and transcendent (to be approached with respect, awe, and, some fear).

IV. READ: Ecclesiastes 6:1-12, On Wealth

V. Questions on Ecclesiastes 6:1-12

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- 1. Why is material wealth never secure?
- 2. Why can't wealth, possessions, and notoriety truly satisfy us?
- 3. Discuss: What things in our week actually have a lasting impact?
- 4. What's the draw/importance of serving in the mission of Jesus? Name some ways to do this.

VI. <u>Life Application Questions</u>

A. Contentment: It is God Who brings joy.

- What makes it hard to be content with what we have rather than pine for what we wish we had or think we deserve?
- How might we see, name, and enjoy God's daily gifts?
- What do you rely on to bring you joy? And, why? Explain.
- Read Psalm 5:11. How might we look to God to help us find **joy** in the midst of it struggle?

B. Reverence: Worship under God's sovereignty.

- Pastor Dave said, "We don't control our own destiny. Even with our own strong will, powerful thoughts, or good vibes, it's impossible for any of us to 'manifest' what *we* desire. If that's what you've been taught, that's actually superstition, *not* Christianity." Discuss.
- Discuss the "life under the sun" secular worldview (where I am the centre of my own universe and *I* can *do*, or, *be* whatever *I* want). Why do you think this prevalent worldview is not working for people in our world?
- Ecclesiastes reminds us: God is God and we are not. How is this scary? How is this comforting? Discuss.
- Spend some time in **prayer** as a group using Psalm 46 (1/10) as your guide: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. He says, '*Be still, and know that I am God*; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."
