Sermon Series: The Build - An Exploration into Nehemiah

Sermon Theme: "It Costs to Build!"

Primary Text(s): Nehemiah 5.

1. Read Nehemiah 5.

- 2. Opening Reflection.
 - a. Prompt for Leaders: Point toward Holy-Spirit awareness, not guilt.
 - i. "What might God be inviting you to sacrifice as you join in what He is building in the world today?"
 - 1. Follow-Up(s): How can our group support or pray with each other in responding to God's invitations to us?
 - ii. Which cost spoke to you most: vulnerability, convenience, or resources?
 - 1. Follow-Up(s): What made that one feel most personal or relevant right now?
- 3. Vulnerability (Nehemiah 5:1-5).
 - a. Prompt for Leaders: Acknowledge emphatically each person's potential struggles and avoid pressure; let people self-determine the level of sharing.
 - i. In your life, where do you tend to choose self-reliance over vulnerability?
 - 1. Follow-Up(s): Who is one trusted person you could invite into your life this season?
- 4. Convenience (Nehemiah 5:6-13).
 - a. Prompt for Leaders: Emphasize grace and growth; not condemnation.
 - i. Can you recall a time you sensed God interrupting your plans?
 - 1. Follow-Up(s): How did you respond, and what did you learn?
 - ii. Which areas of life are hardest for you to surrender convenience?
 - 1. Follow-Up(s): What incremental embraced practices might help create margin this week?
- 5. Resources (Nehemiah 5:14-19).
 - a. Prompt for Leaders: Point to trust, mission, kingdom impact, and keeping Jesus as the center, our Benefactor.



- i. Why do you think God invites us to hold our time, gifts, money, influence, etc. loosely?
 - 1. Follow-Up(s): How does remembering that Jesus paid the ultimate cost change our attitude toward sacrificing resources God has given to us?
 - 2. How does grace empower obedience instead of pressure?

6. Closing Reflections & Prayer

a. One sentence prayer each: "Lord, give me grace to... (be vulnerable / embrace holy inconvenience / give with open hands)."
