Leadership Board Highlights

Annual Review of Building Use Policy:

Members of the congregation are invited to review the church's Building Use Policy, which is provided in the back of your church directory, and you are asked to offer any suggestions for updates or revisions. Annual Review of Cleaning Services Agreement:

At its meeting on October 19, the Leadership Board voted to terminate the Cleaning Services Agreement effective December 31, 2025. Stay tuned for more information about an organized plan for volunteers to pitch in.

2026 Budget:

The Leadership Board approved a total budget for 2026 of providing for the minimum salary for licensed local pastors and anticipated increases in utility costs. The budget also incorporates an increase in property insurance premiums; however, the proposal of another insurer is presently under review. Our Annual Conference apportionment for next year decreased slightly.

New Accounting Software:

The Board approved the acquisition of updated online Quicken software to support the church's financial recordkeeping,


