## Saint Peter's 2025 Bursary for Postulants Awarded to Sean LePage

In 2003 two Saint Peter's parishioners (eight o'clockers!) fulfilled a dream to provide financial support for Anglican students studying at the Atlantic School of Theology. Elizabeth and Charles Taylor, with the help of Warden Ted Johnston established the Charles and Elizabeth Taylor Endowment Fund. Charles passed away shortly after the fund was established. When Elizabeth passed several years later, she matched the initial principal of five thousand dollars already in the fund. Consequently, the fund's principal now stands at \$ 10,000. The Elizabeth and Charles Taylor Bursary is awarded annually to one or more students, seeking ordination in Nova Scotia. This year the bursary was awarded at the October 19<sup>th</sup> service at Saint Peter's to second year postulant Sean LePage. Charles and Elizabeth were very active at Saint Peter's. Charles read at 8 A.M. Elizabeth was an active Altar Guild member. Their commitment to Saint Peter's remains an active one and will be for as long as there is a Saint Peter's, Birch Cove

Contributions can be: completed kits, packages of items such as socks, hard candy, shampoo or body wash, or monetary donations with which mission volunteers will purchase items. Shoeboxes or bags contain: a hat, a scarf, gloves/mitts, socks, wrapped hard candy (no chocolate), soap, toothpaste, shampoo/body wash (350 ml. max), shaving foam, razors, deodorant, lip balm, playing cards, souvenir of Canada, pen/pencil, Christmas card, tissues (small package),comb.
