WELCOME

Whoever you are and wherever you are on your journey in faith, you are welcome.

BUILDING A KINDER, CHRIST-CHILD-LIKE WORLD

As we journey through the changing colours of autumn the Church marks several important feasts and commemorations. First, we encounter the Autumnal Triduum – All Hallows Eve (October 31), All Saints Day (November 1), and All Souls Day (November 2). Followed closely by our national observance of Remembrance Day (November 11), these dates collectively remind us of the Communion of Saints, in heaven and on earth, who have gone before us, sacrificed for us, and cheer us on as we run the race of faith. We then continue through the final weeks of our annual liturgical year until we mark The Reign of Christ, or Christ the King. On this final Sunday in the church year, we are reminded that while human leaders and nations rise and fall, God's love is unfailing, and God's reign endures forever.

During the period beginning Sunday, October 19 and continuing through The Reign of Christ (November 23), the Parish of the Valley will make use of the Coventry Litany of Reconciliation for our communal prayers of Confession and Absolution during our Sunday Eucharistic liturgies. Note that when the sacrament of Holy Baptism is celebrated, the baptism liturgy beginning on page 151 of the Book of Alternative Services takes precedence.

The Coventry Litany of Reconciliation emerges out Coventry Cathedral, UK, and the International Community of the Cross of Nails. Coventry Cathedral was decimated by bombing during the Blitz of the Second World War. The phrase "Father Forgive" was inscribed on the wall of the ruined Cathedral by Provost Dick Howard after the Blitz, where it can still be seen today. Out of these ruins has emerged an international community of disciples who commit to praying to "Build a kinder, Christ-child-like world."

The Coventry Litany of Reconciliation was written by Canon Joseph Poole in 1958 and continues to be prayed in Coventry Cathedral every weekday at noon, and throughout the world by partners in the Community of the Cross of Nails – including our very own Christ Church Cathedral Ottawa. This adaptation of the litany, with the refrain "Creator Forgive" in place of "Father Forgive" is used in our cathedral church.

THE COVENTRY LITANY OF RECONCILIATION

Celebrant: All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God.

Celebrant: The hatred which divides nation from nation, race from race, class from class,

People: Creator, forgive.

Celebrant: The covetous desires of people and nations to possess what is not their own,

People: Creator, forgive.

Celebrant: The greed which exploits the work of human hands and lays waste the earth,

People: Creator, forgive.

Celebrant: Our envy of the welfare and happiness of others,

People: Creator, forgive.

Celebrant: Our indifference to the plight of the imprisoned, the homeless, the refugee,

People: Creator, forgive.

Celebrant: The lust which dishonours the bodies of human beings,

People: Creator, forgive.

Celebrant: The pride which leads us to trust in ourselves and not in God,

People: Creator, forgive.

Silence is kept. The priest then pronounces God's absolution, saying:

Celebrant: Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ

forgave you.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.
