Reflection

Original Vs Photocopy

On the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica: Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? (1 Corinthians 3).

Saint Carlo Acutis (1991-2006) claimed:

We are all born originals, but most of us die as photocopies. Acutis is helping us face the truth:

The saints believed they were temples and they believed they had to be themselves – no one else.

Mary of Egypt (421): Prostitute. She converted bia time and became a desert hermit for 47 years. Fascinating woman.

Augustine (430): Playboy turned spiritual guru. His autobiography still lights up the world. Spiritual genius.

Aquinas (1274): Supposedly a 'dumb ox,' but turned out to be an intellectual and mystical genius. Academic output won't be matched by Al.

Joan of Arc (1431): Illiterate teenager, peasant background, leading armies of men, burned to death at age 19. One tough lady.

Therese of Lisieux (1897): Healed of her neurotic tendencies at age 10 by the Baby Jesus, leads us in trusting in the merciful love of Jesus, not our own merits. What a spiritual tradition we have, from Abraham and Sarah until now.

Be Christ. Be yourself.
