HEWLETT REQUESTS.

- Plumbing problems. We have some plumbing concerns, e.g. leak from the pipes under the kitchen sink, bathroom flushing problem (tank sometimes fills, sometimes doesn't), replacing of old leaky fixtures.
- Air conditioner. Unit in wall has shifted on its wooden base due to worn conditions, causing the water to leak out inside the wall where the ventilation outlet is located. We have buckets catching the water, then we empty the buckets for refilling. This is while the AC is running. When it isn't running, it doesn't leak. And in this hot Florida climate, it keeps running. We have a man that has been helping us for years with our AC service, but at this point he has just been jerry rigging it so as to save us from having to do some replacing, which runs into higher costs (\$1700-1800).
- Nancy's health. Her blood pressure has been going up and down (probably due to her medicines) and sometimes goes as low as the 40s (diastolic) which causes her not to function well. But praise the Lord, she has been in better spirits and with more energy lately. The doctor has cut back on her medicine, and this may be why she has been feeling better. Pray for her.
- Travel expenses. I have my plane ticket for WV, but Nancy is having to wait to see if we can get the extra funds in our financial report in order for her to join us in WV for the week of the Mission Conference. She truly wants to go so she can enjoy the meetings and reunite with many of her old friends there. The pastors and people really enjoy Nancy traveling with me. Pastors have jokingly remarked, "Carl, we don't want to see you, but it's Nancy we really want to see." I don't blame them (even though they were kidding) for saying that. Nancy is a blessing to many, many, people. I certainly miss her when I am by myself on the road. I always tell her that she keeps me from getting lost on the highway when trying to find directions.
