PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Get in the Game

1 Corinthians 9:24-27

New American Standard Bible (NASB)

²⁴ Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win. ²⁵ Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we are imperishable. ²⁶ Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I box in such a way, as not beating the air; ²⁷ but I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified.

In Paul's letter, he speaks to the church at Corinth using an example of something familiar to them – the games. The Isthmian games would have been celebrated in the region in that day, and racers running for the crown of laurel would have been held in high regard by

the people; so Paul uses the metaphor in his teaching. Of course the crown to which Paul is alluding is a much more glorious prize; an incorruptible, heavenly crown.

Kingdom work is not a spectator sport. We are all called to it and we should enter into our calling with a winning mind-set. We should daily strive

to be first in the glorious contest, running persistently in the direction of the cross and leading as many along with us as possible. Sitting on the sidelines, complacently watching is not an option for the Christian. We are called to "get in the game." We should be continuously praying to the Father, telling Him, "Here I am, Lord. Send me."

Races are run on a set course. Deviation from the course comes with penalty and might lead to disqualification. Paul says we should not run without aim, but we should seek God's direction. We should follow the leading of the Holy Spirit so that we do not run the race in vain. And if we are obediently fulfilling our mission, to know Christ and make Him known, then we should remain steadfast and faithful in the maintenance of our mind, body, and soul so that, after we have engaged with and made disciples, we do not fall prey to our own sinful nature and become a stumbling block, or a bad example to those we have disciplined. In Hebrews 12:1 the author says this, "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ²fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith..."

As Christians, people are watching us. Believers or not, they are holding us to a higher standard. Unlike the games, there can be many crowns awarded, not just the one. And so, we are called not only to be runners, but coaches and trainers also, working tirelessly to share the gospel in order that Jesus Christ may bring as many across the heavenly finish line as possible.
