STATEMENTS/IMPERATIVES/COMMANDMENTS IN MATTHEW:

The following is a list of imperatives/commandments that Jesus spoke to His disciples in Matthew; the New Testament uses indicative statements when discussing what God has done, is doing or will do. Imperative statements are used when saying what we should do. It is important to realize, not only that both moods are present in the Bible, but that there is a specific relationship between these two moods in the area of sanctification. Namely, what God commands us to do (the imperative) is based upon what HE has done, is

doing or will do (the indicatives). God is signifying by this consistent pattern that sanctification depends on God, but involves human volition and cooperation. The gospel of Matthew:

- 4:4, Live by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.
- 4:7, Tempt not the Lord thy God.
- 4:10, Worship the Lord thy God..
- 4:10, Serve only the Lord thy God.
- 4:17, Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.
- 4:19, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.
- 5:3, Be humble, spiritually bankrupt apart from God

Be lost and hopeless apart from divine grace)

- 5:4, Be mourning over sin, the godly sorrow that produces repentance leading to salvation.
