
# Notes from the Lilly Pad ?



When we find ourselves in those valleys, we need to remember what God showed Ezekiel in the valley of dry bones. God led Ezekiel back and forth across that valley and kept him there so that He would have a good understanding of just how dead that great army was. Then He reconnected those bones before Ezekiel's eyes, and that reconnection began with a small rattling sound.

Sometimes our ministry has to get rattled up for it to become the ministry that coincides with God's Will. Ministry is fluid and should never become stagnant. The Apostle Paul gives us a great example of how we can minister to people with fluidity by changing our costumes and methods without compromising the Gospel message. Our sacrifice of self could lead someone to an eternity with Jesus.

1 Corinthians chapter 9:19-23, "Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible. To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law. To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings."

God made the tree to give up its clinging leaves as they mature and display God's beauty. This is so that the tree and all of the other plant life and eco system around it will thrive and produce another bountiful season. There will also be times in our walk with Christ that we will also have to give up what we cling so dearly to so that the harvest for God's Kingdom will be bountiful. As mentioned earlier from the Book of Ecclesiastes, "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens".

Let's all work as a unified body and make this next season one that is fertile with love, joy and peace for the Glory and exaltation of our risen savior! Having faith that God's Will is being done at Millfield. Some encouragement from Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will

# **Bags of Hope: Providing Food for Those in Need**

For almost 15 years, Millfield Baptist Church and Ebenezer Baptist Church have worked together to provide a monthly food bank, Bags of Hope, to our community.

In July, August, and September

- 171 families were served
- 6,785 pounds of food was picked up from Food Lion in Courtland
- 6,613 pounds of food was ordered from Southeastern Food Bank of Virginia
- A large amount of produce was provided by SFBV that we were not expecting: grapes, plums, tomatoes, pears, potatoes, and more





Many of the recipients are elderly, several recipients have very large families, some are single mothers, others are from families who have one or two working adults in the family but their income isn't enough to provide the food they need. With the government shut-down and uncertain future of SNAP, the number of families served will probably increase.

This ministry requires many people to make it successful by:

- Picking up food at Food Lion
- Unloading the SFBV truck the second Monday of each month
- Bagging food the Tuesday before the third
