Pastor's Corner

"The Race of Faith"



"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:1-2 ESV)

The author of Hebrews chapter 12 refers to the "great cloud of witnesses" who surrounded the believers. These witnesses are the men and women whose faith stories were chronicled through chapter 11. Having told these stories from the past, the author shifts to focus on the Christians in his own time and refers to the faithful people who have gone before them as a word of encourage-

ment. Their faith stories are our faith stories today; their God is our God. The kind of witnesses and services they had are the same as ours today. The witnesses are examples, or better, they are testimony to the reality of faithfulness; they are not spectators or judges watching and monitoring the performance of the believers. The believers are to look for witnesses who are proof of the reality of a life of full devotion to God. Hebrews 12:1-2 - encourages believers to run the race of faith with endurance, shedding the weight of sin and focusing on Jesus Christ. It emphasizes the importance of perseverance, even when facing hardship, by remembering the example of our Lord Jesus Christ, who endured the cross for the joy that was set before Him.

Once upon a time, in a forest, there lived a speedy hare and a slow but steady tortoise. The hare loved to brag. "I'm the fastest animal in the forest!" he would say, hopping around. "No one can beat me in a race!" The tortoise was friendly and quiet and didn't like showing off. He calmly replied, "Maybe I'm slow, but I'd still like to race you." The hare burst out laughing. "You? Race me? This will be the easiest win of my life!"

All the animals gathered to watch. "Ready, set, go!" shouted the fox, and the race began. The hare zoomed ahead so fast. The tortoise moved slowly, with its short legs and heavy shell. The hare reached a shady tree and looked back. He didn't see the tortoise anywhere. "This is too easy," said the hare. "I'll take a little nap. He'll never catch up anyway." So, the hare curled up under the tree and quickly fell asleep.



Meanwhile, the tortoise kept going - slow and steady. He didn't stop to rest. He didn't stop to snack. He just kept moving, one small step at a time. After a while, the hare woke up and stretched. "It's time to finish the race," he said. But when he looked down the path, he couldn't believe it! The tortoise was almost at the finish line! The hare ran as fast as he could, his feet thumping the ground, but it was too late. The tortoise crossed the finish line first!

All the animals cheered. "Hooray!" The animals shouted happily. "Tortoise, you have won! You are the winner. Hooray!" The tortoise smiled kindly and said, "Slow and steady wins the race." But the hare looked surprised, and a little embarrassed. From that day on, the hare learned not to brag, and he always remembered the lesson from his slow and steady friend.

In the Christian race, you don't need to run rapidly. As believers, we must run the race with perseverance, faith, and hope to win the prize. Hebrews 12:1 reminds us to run our race with perseverance and never give up. Keep trying, keep moving, even when things seem hard.

Yes, the Christian life is a race. The writer of Hebrews said that if we are going to run the Christian life with no distractions and not get off track, we must keep our eyes carefully focused on Jesus Christ, the Author and Finisher of our faith. **God bless everyone!**



continues to collect socks to ship to Terracycle. By doing this, we keep those socks out of the landfills and we earn financial support for Northcott Neighborhood House.








