Steve's Science Tidbits

A Wonderful story of Kindness

Beth Usher was in her 3rd week of kindergarten when she fell off the seesaw. Afterward, she started having seizures, as many as a hundred times a day. She was 5 yrs old.

Her only respite was when she watched Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood. Something about his voice calmed her brain and her body,

She continued to have seizures and, two painful years later, the Usher family finally got an accurate diagnosis—a rare disease that was eating away at the left hemisphere of her brain, called Rasmussen's encephalitis. They found a doctor who could fix the problem—the diseased half of her brain would have to be removed.



Afraid for Beth, the family kept canceling and rescheduling this terrifying surgery. During this time, Beth's mother, Kathy, contacted Fred Rogers' offices and told the person who answered about Beth, hoping that maybe they could send a signed photo. That night, their telephone rang.

Kathy spoke to the caller for a few minutes and then told Beth a friend wanted to talk with her. Beth took the phone from her mother and said hello. She heard a familiar voice and felt immediately at ease. Mr. Rogers asked her about her brain surgery and she told him things she did not even tell her parents. They talked for over an hour. Before she hung up the phone, she told him, "I love you, Mr. Rogers." He told her he loved her too.

She finally had the surgery. The twelve-hour surgery was a success, but Beth's brain stem swelled and she fell into a coma, which lasted for 6 weeks. One day, while keeping vigil in the intensive care unit, Kathy was called to the nurses' station. There was a call from someone claiming to be Mr. Rogers.

He had been calling the Usher house every day to check on Beth, but not hearing back, he called the hospital directly. Hearing the unfortunate news of the coma, he told Kathy he would be praying for Beth. After checking in every day for two weeks without promising news, he insisted on coming for a visit, as long as the hospital didn't publicize his visit.



At the hospital, with family and medical staff peering in from the doorway of Beth's room, Mr. Rogers sat with the comatose Beth for an hour. He opened up the clarinet case he had brought and pulled out replicas of puppets from the Neighborhood of Make-Believe. He sat speaking gently to her while she remained unconscious. Weeks later, Beth finally woke up and was astonished to find herself surrounded by puppets.

Beth stopped having seizures, but had to relearn how to walk and talk, and had issues with short-term memory and some motor control. Mr. Rogers remained her friend, calling her on birthdays or when she got a good report card. When she was 12-yrs-old, Fred Rogers gave the commencement speech at the University of Connecticut where Kathy and Brian Usher both worked, and Beth finally got to meet her hero in person. "He was just as I imagined he would be," she said. "His voice was so kind and gentle and we gave each other a huge hug. I could not help but cry with sheer happiness."

I love working at Mt Zion. Mt Zion is amazing! I love being creative. I get excited about the new ways we try to better care for the community. It's awesome to come in and debate Pastor Tyler about the weirdest topics or theological concepts. It's not everyday you get to work with someone like PT. and it's so much fun!

If Mt Zion doesn't stay adequately funded, our Fun-ding ends. The Leadership Board is working hard to bring in more revenue, but it also takes generous support to make Mt Zion's ministries happen. Four ladies from the Courtyard Apartments next door joined us this past Sunday and we're hoping for even more neighbors next month! We're also starting a Younger Adults group to help 20-and 30- year olds with their unique faith formation needs amid parenting, caretaking, and working. And who knows who will come up with the next great community outreach or event idea? Maybe it's you! Right here, at Mt Zion.

Caring for each other is gratifying (aka, fun). It makes us feel good and we can only hope it helps make the other person feel better, too. It's hard work sometimes, sure, but it is honestly pretty fun. We wouldn't all be here in this place if we did not truly enjoy what we do at Mt Zion—whether you're Pastor Tyler, the admin, a volunteer, part of the Leadership Board, or a musician.

We need each other. Pastor Tyler and I and the staff need each other. We need the congregation. The congregation needs the community. The community needs the building.
