Saturday, December 7 started as a normal Saturday for me. I had just signed on to the Saturday morning ladies' prayer meeting when I heard the WVU Medicine helicopter go over our house to the hospital. It had been and still is my practice to stop whatever I am doing and pray for the patient, medical crew, pilot, and family who are involved. I never know who is involved in the medical emergency but I know it is serious. So, since I was already in prayer, I included all who were involved in this early flight. I didn't think much more about it as our group spent time together. Approximately 10 minutes later my phone rang. It was my sister. She called to tell me her daughter, my niece had just been sent to Ruby to deliver her first child. The pregnancy had been somewhat difficult from the beginning but the doctors had thought she would be able to get to her due date in late February. But at this time, that was still three months away. Later that morning my sister called back to tell me little Callahan had arrived into this world. My niece was doing well but all were very concerned about the baby. Cal weighed only 3.1 lbs but was responding to care.

Many of you prayed for him. Prayer blankets were made and delivered for Mom and Dad. The annual Advent baby blanket was lovingly knitted throughout the services and presented to Baby Cal. By the way, that has become one of his favorite blankies!

Cal will be 10 months old on October 7. He has successfully breezed through heart and hernia surgeries. He just discovered how to crawl and now he is trying to walk! The doctors are amazed at his progress.

Thank you Church Family for loving our family's newest addition. And remember, you may never know the power of your prayer even when you do not know who it is or the circumstances. Keep on praying!

In her book, Somewhere in Heaven, My Mother is Smiling, WV author, Peggy Toney Horton pens this sentence: ""My beloved October has returned—with its brilliant colors, cool temperatures and sunny, cloudless, azure skies, and I must enjoy it before it escapes for another year." This year I am feeling the same. Already, I feel the rush of the passing October days and it is just the first day.

In my deepest memories October reminds me of my mother. Hazel Pauline Oliphant Randolph, who was born in October. That year it was Friday the 13th and my mother always claimed that Friday the 13ths were great days. She loved the colors of October, but did not like Halloween. The woods called to her, even during the years when she was unable to see clearly, she knew that October was full of color and soft breezes and bright blue skies, and a very special day that would often include her favorite meal—hot dogs and German chocolate cake. No matter what day October 13th fell on, my father would make sure there were hotdogs, and he would bake the cake for her. We would try to get her to tell stories as we ate and celebrated her birthday. I cherish those memories and the warm glow that I feel when I think about them.

I hope that October brings memories and a warm glow for you. I hope that you remember what it is like to smell the crisp air and feel the morning chill waking you up. I hope that you remember jumping in a pile of leaves and discovering piles of acorns. I hope that you watch the squirrels preparing for winter, and that the colors are more brilliant this year than any other time that you remember. Buy pumpkins and mums and set them out where your neighborhood can enjoy them as well as you.

October is beautiful, inviting, and a time for reflection.

October is a gift from God.
