





Worship

Affirmation of Faith - The Apostles' Creed: During November, a stretch of Sundays beginning with All Saints Sunday's focus on our being surrounded by the great cloud of witnesses—all those who have gone on before us, the communion of saints—and ending with Christ the King Sunday's celebration of Christ's ultimate rule and reign, we choose to use the words of the "Apostles' Creed" as our communal affirmation of the faith around which we gather. The Apostles' Creed is one of the most ancient and universal Christian statements of faith, with roots dating back to the 1st century AD. This creed is especially connected in Christian tradition with the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, as the symbol of the faith into which each Christian is baptized. In our faith tradition within The United Church of Canada, where we hold together multiple statements from diverse times and contexts as authentic witnesses to the faith around which we gather, we recognize that any of the creeds or confessions of faith we affirm in corporate worship—from the ancient and broadly-ecumenical Apostles' Creed to The United Church's own beloved statement from 1968, A New Creed—serve as testimonies of faith, not tests of faith. In joining our voices to their witnesses, our confession is not one of unquestioning intellectual agreement with each and every word but rather one of profound faith and trust in the God of whom these things are said, the God to whom the faithful witnesses point.

Children are welcome at all services! It is important for families to worship together. Don't feel your child must be absolutely quiet or still, for we are glad to have children—and all their wiggles, giggles, and squiggles—as part of our community and worship life! After all... as an

old saying goes, "faith is caught, not taught!" Children are encouraged to stand and sing with the songs, partake in communion, read and pray along when they can, and join in for the "Early Word"—a time at the front with conversation just for them near the beginning of the service. Most Sundays September through June, we have "Children's Church" activities during the latter two-thirds of the service in the Lounge on the lower level, to which any pre-school through grade 5 aged child is welcome! For those accompanying infants or toddlers who need a spot to 'escape' to during the worship service, feel free to make use of the "Quiet Room" off the side of the sanctuary, near the piano, where there you will find comfortable seating, toys, and a changing table all while being able to hear and see the worship service.



Recording and streaming in use: Please note that video cameras and microphones are capturing our worship services, and that the resulting content may be transmitted over Zoom, YouTube, or other platforms.

Likewise, from time to time still photography of our worship services may be taken and used for church communications, websites, and other uses. By your presence within the sanctuary, you are indicating your consent to the possibility that your likeness may be captured and used in any of these ways. While video capture of congregants in the pews is relatively minimal, if you wish to guarantee you will not ever be depicted on video, the area at the rear centre of the pew seating area is unable to be picked up on camera.



Washrooms can be found just outside the sanctuary through the door at the front right of the space (the northeast corner of the room).

God's Mission, Our Gifts

Partnering for Climate Responsibility: When members of the Diakonia of The United Church of Canada (DUCC) prepared to travel to Tanzania for the World Diakonia Conference, they knew their flights would carry a heavy carbon cost.

Together, they decided to take collective responsibility for that footprint.



At the time, The United Church of Canada didn't yet have a carbon offset program. DUCC members were determined to find a credible and meaningful way to act. They reached out to the Canadian Foodgrains Bank and contributed to its Nature+ program, which supported communities in Kenya, Ethiopia, Mozambique, and Zimbabwe who were revitalizing the land through nature-based solutions: planting trees, restoring soil, improving biodiversity, and strengthening food security.

Their example inspired change. Because of the DUCC members' faithful leadership in charting a path, the United Church established a carbon offset option through Mission and Service. This made it possible for anyone travelling for church work or personal reasons to contribute to a climate action project supported by Mission and Service and the Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

Through this partnership, the National Council of Churches of Kenya (NCCK) is working closely with communities in Kitui County to provide training on conservation agriculture and other sustainable farming techniques, beekeeping, and land and water conservation, reaching more than 11,000 people adapt to climate change. The United Church accompanies the NCCK on this exciting climate initiative.

What began as one group's effort to travel responsibly grew into an ongoing movement of faithful action. Today, your gifts for Mission and Service continue to support this carbon offset program, caring for creation and planting seeds of hope around the world.
