NO SHAVE NOVEMBER

We're also raising money to provide some of the meal items for the Thanksgiving Meal at the Lutheran Church of the Holy Communion in Philly. All this seems especially timely given the disruption with SNAP payments because of the government shutdown.

What if I put a jar out in the entryway...? Could you say no to a second grader asking for money to do something embarrassing with Pr. Christian's beard? I think we'll set a "goal"—don't know what that'll be yet—and sometime in December, I'll get shaved. Guys—any of you want to participate? (Please, embarrassment loves company.) This could be fun and for a good cause. What's better than that?

COLLECTION FOR HATS, GLOVES, SCARVES & SOCKS





You can choose one of these options when you sign up to provide a meal:






CALL FOR WORSHIP ASSISTANTS!
