

"The Called" (Exodus Series - Ep. 1)

As we trace Moses' life in Exodus, we see how God led him—and the people of Israel—from bondage to breakthrough.

You're not just reading about deliverance—you're being invited to walk in it.

"But the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left. That day the Lord saved Israel from the hands of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians lying dead on the shore. And when the Israelites saw the mighty hand of the Lord displayed against the Egyptians, the people feared the Lord and put their trust in Him and in Moses His servant." Exodus 14:29-3

The Three Peaks of Exodus:

- God's Deliverance (Chapters 1-15) Exodus 14:29-31
- God's Covenant (Chapter 16-24)

"Moses then took the blood, sprinkled it on the people and said, 'This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words." Exodus 24:8

•God's <u>Dwelling</u> (Chapters 25-40)

"Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle." Exodus 40:34

*God Calls Us

1. From Crisis to Purpose.

"The Bible says that our real problem is that every one of us is building our identity on something besides Jesus." -Timothy Keller

Our true identity and purpose can only be found in personally knowing the one who created us. Moving us from identity crisis to identified calling.

"When the child grew older, she took him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. She named him Moses, saying, 'I drew him out of the water." Exodus 2:10

2. From Failure to Future.

"When Pharaoh heard of this, he tried to kill Moses, but Moses fled from Pharaoh and went to live in Midian, where he sat down by a well. Now a priest of Midian had seven daughters, and they came to draw water and fill the troughs to water their father's flock. Some shepherds came along and drove them away, but Moses got up and came to their rescue and watered their flock." Exodus 2:15-17

Even in our failure and in our running and hiding, God is still at work as He was in Moses life leading him to his future and ordering our steps.

3. From Ordinary to Holy.

"One encounter with God can change it all!" -Steven MacDonald

"When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, 'Moses! Moses!' And Moses said, 'Here I am.' 'Do not come any closer,' God said. 'Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground." Exodus 3:4-5

When we encounter the power of God; it's in those "burning bush" moments where ordinary ground becomes holy. His call in your life is holy and significant.

4. From Unqualified to Equipped.

"So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" Exodus 3:10-11

"God equips the called—not just the qualified!" -Unknown

"Moses said to God, 'Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you," and they ask me, "What is his name?" Then what shall I tell them?' God said to Moses, 'I AM who I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: "I AM has sent me to you." Exodus 3:13-14
