- 1. Think about the last big event you had to plan (wedding, reunion, birthday, or trip). At what point in your planning did you nail down the date?
- 2. When's the first time you heard about Jesus' Return? How did it make you feel?
- 3. Read 1 Thessalonians 5:1-8 and review the sermon outline. What stands out for you?
- 4. Doug mentioned several reasons why God doesn't just give us a calendar of end-time events. What are some other reasons that come to mind?
- 5. Verse 2 says the day will come like a thief in the night. What does that metaphor teach us about the nature of the Lord's return?
- 6. Why do you think Paul links faith and love with the breastplate (protecting the heart) rather than hope?
- 7. How does hope act like a helmet, protecting your mind and perspective (v.8)?
- 8. In practical terms, what does it look like to stay spiritually alert in your daily routines?
