September 9, 2025

Council president Kay Shelton called the meeting to order at 5:32pm. Those attending were Pastor Lars Hammar, Julie Swenson, Anne Swant, Barbara Hoffman, Karleen Heintzberger, Janet Mobley, Melanie Hein and Emily Stone.

Kay Shelton gave devotions.

The August minutes were approved by email affirmation on August 19, 2025.

Financial Report: Gordon Heimbigner submitted a written financial report for the month of August.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor Lars provided a written report to Council

Committee Reports:

Property: Anne is continuing to look for members to join her for a property committee for the

church.

Personnel: No report.

Finance & Budget: At the end of August CLC is right on our revenue and spending plan for the year. We are 8 months through the year (67%). Our revenue is at 67.5% of budget and our expenses are at 65.9%. We are currently in this position because we had exceptional offerings early in the year. In the month of August, revenue was more than \$10,000 LESS THAN BUDGET and expenses were almost \$7,500 OVER BUDGET. This is not unusual for a summer month, but concerning. Hopefully this will be corrected as we head into fall.

Worship: No report for the Newsletter. Please sign up for worship duties, including coffee hour!

Evangelism: Erin is working on member lists over several categories including voting members list. Kay, Pastor Lars and Karleen will be reviewing the lists. Name tag Sunday will be Sept. 14.

Fellowship: We have Brats & Brews as well as Confirmation Sunday both in October. Details to come.

Outreach: Mission group- October is rapidly approaching, which means shipping our quilts and personal care kits is just around the corner. Quilt Sunday is September 21, when the quilts will be displayed in the sanctuary, and there will be a good will offering for shipping costs. As we are all aging, the Mission group is looking for anyone who is interested in helping to carry on the mission work to join us on Tuesday mornings or evenings. Sewing is not a requirement.

Christian Aid and Sleep Center continue to serve meals each month as the number of mouths to feed increases.

Social Justice and Advocacy continue to meet each month. RIC is going strong. They are laying the groundwork/timeline for the congregational vote on December 7. Bulletin boards, education opportunities, and forums are in the plans leading up to the vote.

Habitat for Humanity is planning an event on October 3 to help support their construction of 7 townhouses. Watch for posters.

Spark, an outreach of Catholic Charities is holding a winter coat drive for teenage youth in our area during the month of September. We have posters hanging by the coat rack in the narthex where the coats will be placed until they are picked up. We are working with the youth on the food drive as bins are placed and people are encouraged to bring nonperishable food on a regular basis.

Youth Education: We had a great start to Godly Play. Sara wrote her own GP story about young Jesus and we had 12 students to kick off the year.

Youth and Family: The Crusin' Carnival went well in large part to all the volunteers that helped with set up and take down. Kirsten will form a committee to help with events in the future. The next youth event should be the Corn Maze in October.

Adult Education: We have just started a six-week session, which is a book study on the writings of Clarence Jordan. Paul Anderson is helping with the teaching. That will take us to the end of October, which is reformation Sunday, as well as confirmation.

Working with Pastor Lars and SJAG, we sketched out a plan to use adult education time in November to offer sessions in preparation for the congregational meeting on December 7 to vote on the recommendation for Christ Lutheran to become an RIC congregation. As we move into October more information will be available.

Stewardship: No report.

Continuing Business:

Pastor Lars updated Council on the upcoming Stewardship Drive.

New Business:

Council had a preliminary discussion regarding a potential restructuring and nominations for the 2026 Council.

The new ELCA Model Constitution and Bylaws Update was discussed.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

Who is on the Voting Member List?

The Voting Members of a congregation are distinguished from "inactive" or "removed" members. Here's what each category means:

Voting Members are confirmed members of the congregation who commune and donate at least once a year. Members without a donation record or who have not attended are moved to an Inactive List, but they are not removed from church membership. Inactive just means they can't vote, but are made active again as soon as they (commune and give. Baptized members become Voting Members when they are confirmed at Christ Lutheran. Members may be removed for several reasons, including: transfer to another church, death, or after being on the Inactive List for several years.

The Voting Member list was updated in September, per church constitutional requirements. This update will give us a "starting point" for Inactive Members. To verify whether you or a family member is on the 2025 Voting Member list, or considered inactive, please check with Pastor Lars or Erin. Corrections will be made if errors are found. At Congregational Meetings in December and January, all are welcome, but only Voting Members from the 2025 update will vote.

Can I give to other nonprofits (like Lutheran World Relief) along with my general budget offerings?

Good question! It is best to give to nonprofits directly, not using Christ Lutheran as a go-between with the expectation that a check for your personal donation will be sent from the church. The exception is when "seasonal donations" are made to Good Gifts, 40 Days of Giving, or non-profits selected by the Church Council for mid-week offerings during Advent and Lent. A lump-sum check for these donations is sent after the donation period ends. Suggestions for where to send the upcoming mid-week Advent donations may be made to a Church Council member. Thank you for giving generously.
