

Luke 24: The Table — A New Dawn"

1. The Table as a Meeting Place

The sermon describes the table as the place where we meet with God, gather with others, and invite our neighbors.

Question:

What does "the table" look like in your life right now — your place of meeting with God, community, or invitation to others?

2. The Road to Emmaus

You spoke of the "road to Emmaus" as the path we take when hope feels lost or when we return to what's familiar.

Question:

When life doesn't go as expected, where do you tend to go — emotionally, mentally, or spiritually — on your own "road to Emmaus"?

3. Recognizing Jesus in the Journey

The travelers didn't recognize Jesus walking with them until later.

Question:

Can you recall a time when you only realized in hindsight that God was with you during a difficult season? What helped you recognize Him afterward?

4. The Invitation

The sermon noted that Jesus waited for the disciples' invitation before revealing Himself more fully.

Question:

In what areas of your life might Jesus be waiting for your invitation to draw nearer or reveal more of Himself?

5. Eyes Opened at the Table

When Jesus broke the bread, their eyes were opened.

Question:

What practices or "table moments" (like prayer, Scripture, worship, or fellowship) most often help open your eyes to see God's presence?

6. Habits that Shape Us

You mentioned that habits shape us, for better or worse, and that spiritual rhythms help us notice God's activity.

Question:

What daily or weekly rhythm could you start (or restart) that would help you "turn to the horizon" and see God's work more clearly?

7. A New Dawn

The sermon ends with the image of not missing the sunrise — God's faithfulness breaking through.

Question:

What "new dawn" might God be inviting you into right now — a renewed hope, a change in direction, or a deeper awareness of His presence?
