




# Treasurer\$ Note\$

#### Outlook for the Remainder of 2025

To reach our budget goals and address a deficit of \$73,776, Saint Andrew's congregation must raise \$223,634 during the final two months of the year. Last year, contributions totaled \$65,087 in November and \$138,758 in December. Based on this history, our targets for 2025 are set at \$75,000 for November and \$148,366 for December. Achieving these goals is possible with the support and generosity of our church community.

The progress toward meeting the November goal of \$75,000 is being tracked and displayed on the thermometer graphic to the right, allowing everyone to see how close we are to reaching this important milestone.



#### **Encouragement for Thanksgiving Giving**

As Thanksgiving approaches, it is a meaningful time to reflect on the blessings we have received — both individually and as a church family. We encourage everyone to consider making a generous Thanksgiving offering to help support the mission and ongoing work of Saint Andrew's.

#### **Healing Prayer FAQ**

I have been participating in the Healing Prayer Ministry for many years now at our church. Here are some questions we hear from time to time.

## Why do people go to the back of the church to the kneeling stations on the third Sunday of the month?

Some people come for prayer for their own healing, pain, depression, sorrow, or other situations that arise (jobs, divorce, etc.)

Others offer prayers for friends and family or events in our world.

Sometimes prayers of thanksgiving and praise are requested.

#### What prayer does the Healing Prayer Minister use?

We have all attended training sessions and learned the general parts of prayers of supplication. I always begin with praise for this opportunity to worship and pray together. I request God's healing touch for the situation that has been brought to me. I use touch on the shoulder during the prayer and offer to anoint with oil afterwards.

The prayer always ends in the name of Jesus. Jesus promised us, "You may ask me for anything in my name and I will do it." John 14:13

#### Why do you use anointing oil?

This is an ancient rite going back to the prophet Samuel anointing David. (I Samuel 16:13). It was also practiced widely in the New Testament.

We use aromatic oils that have herbal properties that have been blessed in a special church service. We also have pure olive oil for anyone who requests it.

#### Who can be a Healing Prayer Minister?

If you are interested in becoming a Healing Prayer Minister, contact Cheryl Jurrus. We will be having more training classes in the coming year. "For everyone who asks, receives; he who seeks, finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened."

#### Food of the Month November

This year, again, we will be packing Emergency Bags for the Hopelink Food Bank. So, during the months of October and November, we will be collecting the food items to go in the Emergency Bags. Hopelink has asked that we pack "No-Cook" bags as we did last year. They need these to support those with no access to cooking facilities (homeless). **We will pack 80 at the Advent Fair!!** 

The items in these bags need to be able to be eaten directly without being heated or the use of a can opener. These need to be things that can be eaten cold and plain.


- \*\*All canned items must have a pop-top lid. Only soups and meals are in cans.
- \*\*PAY ATTENTION TO SIZES. Keeping the weight down is important for homeless. Bigger sizes can't be used.
- \*\*MAKE SURE TO CHECK EXPIRATION DATES. They need to be on or after February 2026.

There are seven different items that go in each "No-Cook" Emergency Bag. We will be collecting these items during October and November:

Here are the seven items we will be collecting:

- 1 **Peanut Butter** (~16 oz. plastic jar no-stir)
- 1 **Applesauce or Fruit Cups Package** (packages of 4 or 6 cups (about 4 ounce cups), kept in original packaging so that it contains the label, ex: peaches, pears, fruit cocktail, applesauce)
- 2 **Pouched Meat or Jerky** (beef jerky or meat sticks (like slim Jims) , pouched meat like tuna, chicken, salmon (Starkist is a common brand) Common sizes for both are about 2.5 3 ounces.)
- 2 **Canned Meals/Soups** (ex: ~15-20 oz, ex: chili, beef stew, canned ravioli, hearty Progresso soups (such as: beef pot roast, chicken pot pie, Italian Wedding, etc. **Pop-Top lid**)
- 6 **Granola Bars** (look for ones that are at least 150 200 calories each total at least 1,000 calories)
- 5 **Snack Items** (high in calories & will not crush easily. Ex: dried fruit, nuts, trail mix. Individual packages look for ones that are at least 100 150 calories each total at least 500 calories)
- 2 **Shelf-Stable Drinks** (Something that does not require refrigeration and will not puncture easily. Ex: juice boxes, water, protein shakes.)

Here is the progress chart as of November 11<sup>th</sup>. Check here to see what is needed to pack the most emergency bags: Note the most needed items this week are Peanut Butter, Drinks, Applesauce/Fruit Cups and Snack Items.



#### Helping the People Effected by Devastating Storms In Western Alaska and the Caribbean





Western Alaska was hit hard by the remains of Typhoon Halong and so much was destroyed just as winter is setting in. Homes have been damaged and destroyed, critical infrastructure compromised, and subsistence resources disrupted. Then Hurricane Melissa has hit Jamaica and the Caribbean, causing extensive damage. You may be wondering how you can help the thousands of people affected by these storms.

First off, pray for the people impacted by these storms. May God's healing presence bring them peace and hope in their time of need and give strength to those working diligently to provide relief for the people affected.

Our Outreach and Servant Ministries Committee investigated how to best help the people affected in western Alaska. The ELCA Alaska Synod recommended providing support to The Western Alaska Disaster Relief Fund through the nonprofit The Alaska Community Foundation. The Alaska Community Foundation is partnering with the Alaska Federation of Natives, the Association of Village Council Presidents, the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation, Kawerak, Inc. Maniilaq Association and a number of other local, regional and statewide groups.

Our Outreach committee has directed \$900 from the New Opportunity fund to The Alaska Community Foundation for their "Western Alaska Disaster Relief Fund". The committee also directed \$925 from the New Opportunity Fund to Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) to their "Hurricane Response" effort. LDR will use 100% of the funds to assist those affected by hurricanes.

As an ELCA congregation we are not only connected locally to the Northwest Washington Synod, but also to the churchwide ELCA working in various departments out of the Chicago offices. One of those departments is that of Global Mission which

relates to the worldwide church, Lutheran as well as other denominations. Part of our synodical support goes to ELCA Global Mission outreach in addition to our budgeted item. Together we participate in larger projects and accomplish so much more than we can do as a single congregation.


From June 1998 through March 2010, Saint Andrew's supported Jean Wahlstrom and Marvin Kananen as full-time missionaries to serve in Tanzania under the supervision of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania (ELCT). Since then we have continued our relationship with Global Mission as part of our Outreach budget.

Global Mission sends out a monthly e-news called *GLOBAL LINKS* that keeps us informed of their ministry. See <u>ELCA.org/globalmission</u> to subscribe. This last issue highlighted the following:

The Rev. Imad Mousa Dawood Haddad was elected bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land in June. In an address to the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, he spoke of the situation in the Holy Land and the challenges that his church faces. "As Lutherans, our churches are part of the same vine. You, too, are a church called to abide in Jesus and bear fruit," Haddad said.

ELCA Global Mission welcomed 20 new missionaries serving in 11 different countries at the ELCA Missionary Orientation in July. Our new global personnel are serving in roles such as pastors, teachers, Seminary Horizon International interns, coordinators and more. Over the two-week orientation with worship and fellowship, our new missionaries learned about missionary sponsorship, the companion synod program and the cultural context of their countries of service. Additionally, they learned about accompaniment (the ELCA's approach to global mission) and the MERGE justice principles (migration justice, environmental justice, racial justice, gender justice and economic justice) that influence their work and ministry.

#### Saint Andrew's Constitution Task Force

The Constitution Task Force (CTF) has submitted to the Congregation Council its recommendations for changes to the Saint Andrew's Constitution. Major recommendations submitted to the Council include:

- Reducing the number of elected adult Council member positions from twelve (12) to nine (9).
- Keeping the normal term length for elected adult Council members at three (3) years.
- Allowing Council officers to serve three consecutive one-year terms in the same office, but only with unanimous Council approval. (Currently, officers are limited to serving two consecutive terms in the same office.)
- Providing the Council flexibility on whether or not to fill a vacancy on the Council.
- Allowing for a range of four to six members on the Nominating Committee (current requirement is six members.)

At its November 10 meeting, the Congregation Council plans to decide whether or not to forward these CTF recommendations to the congregation to vote on. 


