Reflection

Ora et Labora

Our second reading crescendos:

In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat (2 Thessalonians 3).

On the one hand, work is a *necessity*. On the other hand, work is a *calling*.

Jesus made this abundantly clear by his life of work in Nazareth, so much so, that St. Pope John Paul II called his ordinary life the **fifth Gospel.**

St. Benedict (480-547) bequeaths to us a most harmonious religious rule of life:

Obedience - Stability - Conversion of life.

We are to live a life of prayer and work – **Ora et Labora.** Notice what is going on here:

Work of the heart. Work of the hands.

We worship God during times of personal and communal prayer. We worship God during times of manual and intellectual work.

The Offertory Prayers of Mass make it easy for us to understand this important spiritual doctrine:

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life. Amen.


