Welcome Deacon Nick Bates - Sunday, November 16

ELCA Deacon **Nick Bates** is the director of Hunger Network in Ohio (HNO) and will be our guest preacher **Sunday, November 16th.** He will also be available between services and following 10:00 worship for anyone that would like to learn more about advocacy around the Statehouse and recent SNAP challenges.

Since 2004, Deacon Nick Bates has worked in the non-profit advocacy and organizing sector on issues related to state budget, anti-poverty, and other public policy issues. Nick graduated from Capital University Law School and Trinity Lutheran Seminary in 2012.

Nick serves as a Deacon in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) called to ministries of advocacy and social justice. He serves on various committees and boards within the faith and secular community. In 2023, he was elected to the Greater Hilltop Area Commission in Columbus – a regional advisory board to Columbus City Council where he chairs the zoning committee. Deacon Bates has lived in the hilltop neighborhood since 2007 with his wife Katie and two children ages 15 and 10.

Thankfull Holiday Meal Bags

The Lutheran Social Services Network of Hope provides hope and healing for people in crisis. The LSS Food Pantries serve people in need by offering a source of nourishment to families who are food insecure. Active in hunger relief since 1927, the LSS Food Pantries operate an eight-county food pantry system, one of Ohio's largest. Our pantries provide emergency food to 3,800 families each month.

Our holiday traditions are deeply intertwined with food. But tough choices – between food or medicine, food or utilities, food or transportation, and even food or housing – mean that many of our neighbors struggle to enjoy the festive meal that graces the Thanksgiving table. You can help by donating Thank*full* Holiday meal bags to help families in need celebrate Thanksgiving! Bags are distributed to families with a turkey, bread and produce for their Thanksgiving meal.

Bags should contain (only):

- 2 pouches or one box of mashed potatoes
- 2 cans or jar of fruit (peaches, applesauce, pears, etc.)
- 3 cans of green beans
- 2 cans of corn
- 2 cans of pumpkin
- 1 can of cranberry sauce
- 1 box or bag of stuffing mix
- 1 turkey gravy packet
- 1 boxed cake/dessert mix

Contents should be assembled in reusable shopping bags and brought to church by Sunday, November 16.

First English Breakfast Ministry

Neighbor-to-Neighbor

There has been much turmoil in our country regarding hunger and health concerns. These are difficult times for people in central Ohio who are marginalized. As Christians, we identify with the Good Samaritan story and recognize that all God's people are our neighbors, and we all suffer when anybody suffers. A challenging question is, how can we as individuals and as a church be good neighbors?

One answer to this question is to be involved in serving the poor. Holy Trinity is an active participant in several ministries including working at the Lutheran Social Services Food Pantry and serving meals at First English and the YWCA Family Center.

Another answer is to be an advocate for the marginalized. The Hunger Network in Ohio (HNO) is a faith-based nonprofit network that works to end hunger in Ohio by addressing the root causes of poverty through

public policy advocacy. ELCA Deacon **Nick Bates** is the director of HNO and will be our guest preacher at Holy Trinity on **Sunday, November 16th.** He will also be available between services and following 10:00 worship for anyone that would like to learn more about advocacy around the Statehouse and recent SNAP challenges. Holy Trinity, the Southern Ohio Synod of the ELCA, and others support HNO and Nick in this ministry. (see Deacon Nick Bates' bio at the top of this week's news)

Ordinary Notes, The Devil's Half Acre, and Lotus Bloom and the Afro Revolution are books of note for this month. This literature intends to expand our awareness, theology and/or acceptance of diverse viewpoints. We in Neighbor to Neighbor hope you'll discover how these writings from various generations embrace what it means to be human and to walk in spirit. ...

Ordinary Notes by Sharpe, Christina

Explore this series of 248 notes. Their themes and tones, sometimes about language, beauty, memory; sometimes about history, art, photography, and literature—always attend to the ordinary-extraordinary dimensions of Black life.

The Devil's Half Acre by Green, Kristen

New York Times bestselling author Kristen Green draws on years of research to tell the extraordinary and little-known story of young Mary Lumpkin, an enslaved woman who blazed a path of liberation for thousands. She was forced to have the children of a brutal slave trader and live on the premises of his slave jail, known as the "Devil's Half Acre." When she inherited the jail after the death of her slaveholder, she transformed it into "God's Half Acre," a school where Black men could fulfill their dreams. It still exists today as Virginia Union University, one of America's first Historically Black Colleges.

Lotus Bloom and the Afro Revolution by Winston, Sherri

This story features a young Black girl who summons the courage to fight against her school's dress code. Lotus Bloom just wants to express herself--with her violin, her retro style, and her peaceful vibe, not to mention her fabulous hair.
