Our Ministries

MUSIC GROUP: Paul Bourgeois

Purpose: To provide music and music leadership for our worship services. The choir leads the music throughout the year at the 10 a.m. Sunday service, as well as other special seasonal services such as Christmas and Holy Week.

Practice: Typically, our practices are held Thursday evening at the church at 7:30 pm. Our practice sessions are normally about one and a half hours long.

Materials: We ask you to bring your voice and enthusiasm. (There is a brief audition) The ability to read music would be an asset but is certainly not required. The music is provided and Sunday selections are e-mailed to the group a few days before practice.

Fellowship: We try to get together as a group with our spouses a couple of times a year for some relaxation and fellowship.
