Sermon



The Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. Who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified. Who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Stewardship of our Church

Stewardship is just a fancy word meaning taking responsibility of the things that are important to us. Over the stewardship season we will explore stewardship of a variety of things in our lives.



God's strategy for healing the world is to bring his beloved children together into one great family—the Church. In doing this, God accomplishes two things. First, he brings healing to the individual members of his family, for we find true healing only in community. Second, he equips his family—the Church—to carry on the work of healing that he began in us.

We are called to a beautiful, God-inspired ministry in a sacred place—a building and a forest—gifted to us by our spiritual ancestors. Now it is our turn to care for it faithfully and to pass it on to those who come after us.

How do we ensure we are faithful stewards of God's Family, the Church?

First, let's remember that the church is primarily people. We need to tend to our relationships with everyone who is part of this community. Encouraging, forgiving, helping, and loving with the same grace that God showed to us in Jesus Christ. I wonder how you can support your Christian colleagues in this place.

Second, we do our part to ensure that what we have inherited from our spiritual ancestors is tended to, loved, kept up so that our spiritual descendants have the same strong foundation for ministry as we had. I wonder how you can dedicate time to caring for the space in which our Parish stands - the forest, the gardens, the windows, the floors, the storage rooms. Is there time you can dedicate to maintaining this holy space?
