## The Master's Builders at Camp Garwood, Mo.

On March 31st, The Master's Builders began work on a newly poured slab at Camp Garwood, in Garwood, Missouri. The camp is about 12 1/2 miles NE of Van Buren, Missouri. This was our first time going to Camp Garwood to work, and we were so very blessed during our time there. The Camp Director, Chris Polk, and his wife, Laura, were so caring and concerned about our needs as we settled in for our two weeks of work. We were all able to stay in a newly renovated dorm there, and that made it so convenient for the job site and the cafeteria.

The Builders were at Camp Garwood to help with a 20 X 60 building. This building includes two living quarters for visiting evangelists, group leaders, etc., on one side, and a nurse's station and quarters on the other. Between the two sides of the building Chris Polk wanted to make sure to include a nice breezeway that will have a large ceiling fan and benches. This will help facilitate check-in and a cool-down area for campers. The Builders framed the building, put in doors and windows, hung metal siding in two colors on the exterior, and the electrical wiring was run for the building. Joe McElroy and Jacob Hale of McElroy Construction did the trusses and added the metal roofing. It was such a pleasure to have these guys do this work as the Builders are no longer able to set trusses!

While we were there, this area of Missouri and Arkansas had historical and catastrophic flooding. The Builders were unable to work on the building for 2 days. Several locations around the area received 12 to 15 inches of rain, and the creeks and hollows filled up quickly! We had to keep a close eye on the camp creek for a couple of days! There were also several tornadoes, and The Builders were thankful that none touched down near the camp. The rain set us back a bit but we enjoyed two afternoons of movies in the cafeteria and some delicious meals.

The BMA Churches of Southeast Missouri certainly kept us well-fed! We were overwhelmed and blessed by their commitment to making sure we lacked for nothing. Meals, supplies, desserts, and snacks were either brought in or money was sent in to help with providing meals for us. These were the churches I have listed that helped, and if I missed any, please forgive me and know we so appreciate each one of you: Stoney Point Baptist, Matthews Baptist, Ohlman Baptist, Bates Creek Baptist, Black River Baptist, Zion Baptist Church, and Kewanee Baptist. Also, on the two Sundays, we had a wonderful lunch at the two churches we attended: Lower Doe Run and Ohlman Baptist. A big "Thank You" to everyone for loving on us through your kitchens! The folks at Ohlman came in one evening during the rain and fried fish with all the "fixins" for us for supper! There were several ladies that spent hours at the cafeteria and at their homes to make sure we were never hungry. Thank you to these special people: Beatrice Evans (Ms.Bea), who was ALWAYS there, early to late every single day; Barbara Werley (Ms. Barbie), who cooked AND made sure the Builders stayed organized, Laura Polk (who cooked a wonderful rib dinner for us), Sharon Lourance and her mother, Joan (who provided endless snacks and a full thanksgiving meal), and Janet Widger who also spent many days in the kitchen preparing meals and helping Ms. Bea and Ms. Barbie. Janet also pleased a bunch of old folks one evening with cornbread, beans, and fried potatoes for supper! Janet Widger also served with the "Just The Crumbs", Disaster Relief ministry, while they were serving the community of Des Arc, Mo. She had also helped Bro. Lavon Hayden of Mississippi, Doyle Morris of Oklahoma, and Dwynn Morrow of Mississippi in this ministry in North Carolina. The town of Des Arc was almost totally destroyed in the March 14 tornado outbreaks. What a compassionate, loving, and caring group of people who serve in this ministry! Two of our Master's Builders ladies had the opportunity to help in Des Arc and saw firsthand the full impact of their ministry.

While working at the camp, we had the opportunity to reconnect with former missionary to the Philippines, Bro. Melvin Meade and his wife, Carolyn. What a surprise to learn they were so close and then being blessed to attend their church services and eat a meal with them! We also learned that Bro. Meade is an accomplished artist, and craftsman. He gifted each Master's Builders family with a beautifully decorated cedar birdhouse. Thank you to these special people and their church family.

Several men came and helped with the building when they could, and they were a great blessing to The Master's Builders. These included: Chris Polk, Camp Director and Pastor at First Missionary Baptist Matthews, and his father, Lonnie Polk; Claude Evans, Pastor of Stony Point Baptist Church; Terry Sharpe, Pastor of Ohlman Baptist Church; Melvin Meade, Pastor of Lower Doe Run Baptist Church; Matt Bolen, Jeff Reynolds, Johnny Beardsley, and of course Joe McElroy and Jacob Hale. I may have missed some, but we do appreciate each one of you!

There is so much more that I would love to include, but this article is getting quite lengthy. We plan to head out to Go Forth Baptist Church in Kilgore, Texas to work next. While there, we plan to help with framing walls inside a metal building on site to provide a gym space, classrooms, a kitchen, and bathrooms. We plan to begin work on Monday, April 28<sup>th,</sup> for two weeks. Come by and visit us and see what is going on if you are in the area. We would love to see you! Please pray for this ministry! We need workers if we are to continue.
