Dear Chartwell family,

I will confess, normally this statement would create a mild sense of anxiety in me. But at the same time, we recognize that it is *in us and through us*—God's people, that His kingdom comes and His will is done on earth. It comes when, by the Spirit, we *imitate and incarnate* the love, grace, and justice of Jesus to those around us.
