

WORD

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

First Reading Isaiah 65:17-25

Addressing the exiles who had returned to Jerusalem from Babylon, the prophet proclaims a vision of a future time of peace and prosperity. Though the returned exiles are experiencing hard times, God is about to do a new thing.

For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. ¹⁸ But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating, for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy and its people as a delight. ¹⁹ I will rejoice in Jerusalem and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it or the cry of distress.

- ²⁰ No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days or an old person who does not live out a lifetime, for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.
- ²¹ They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit.
- ²² They shall not build and another inhabit they shall not plant and another eat, or like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands.
- ²³ They shall not labor in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be offspring blessed by the LORD—and their descendants as well.
- ²⁴ Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear.
- ²⁵ The wolf and the lamb shall feed together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, but the serpent—its food shall be dust! They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, says the LORD.

At the conclusion of the reading, the assembly responds: **Thanks be to God.**

Second Reading

2 Thessalonians 3:6-13

Some members of the Thessalonian community, because of their belief in the nearness of Christ's return, had ceased to work, living off the generosity of other members of the community. The writer of this letter warns them bluntly that if they want to eat, they need to work.

Now we command you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from every brother or sister living irresponsibly and not according to the tradition that they

received from us. ⁷ For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not irresponsible when we were with you, ⁸ and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹ This was not because we do not have that right but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰ For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹ For we hear that some of you are living irresponsibly, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹² Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

At the conclusion of the reading, the assembly responds: **Thanks be to God.**

- ⁹ "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified, for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." ¹⁰ Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom; ¹¹ there will be great earthquakes and in various places famines and plagues, and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.
- 12 "But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to

synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. ¹³ This will give you an opportunity to testify. ¹⁴ So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance, ¹⁵ for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be betrayed even by parents and siblings, by relatives and friends, and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your endurance you will gain your souls."

*What is a Land Acknowledgement?

A land acknowledgment statement recognizes the original Indigenous stewards of a particular territory, their enduring connection to the land, and the historical and ongoing dispossession they have faced. It is a conscious step toward reconciliation and repairing relationships with Native communities, but should be a starting point for deeper understanding and action, not a solitary, empty gesture.

Key Components of a Land Acknowledgement

- Acknowledge the Land: Name the specific Indigenous peoples who are the traditional and ongoing stewards of the land.
- Recognize Ongoing Connection: Emphasize that Indigenous peoples' relationship with their ancestral lands continues, rather than framing it as a past event.
- **Acknowledge History:** Honestly address the history of colonization and dispossession that led to the current situation.
- **Center Indigenous Peoples:** Focus on the present-day presence and sovereignty of Native communities.
- **Honest Reflection and Action:** Acknowledge your own role in the treaty relationship and commit to taking further steps toward equity and reconciliation. You can go to native-land.ca or www.elca.org/indigenous to learn more.

What do you love about Lutheran Church of the Redeemer?

Each of us has our own reasons. Recently, we've heard people talk about how they've been welcomed and accepted here at Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. We've heard people talk about they love serving Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, as well as how our church serves other. We've heard people talk about how they consider the people of Lutheran Church of the Redeemer to be family. What are your reasons? What do you love about Lutheran Church of the Redeemer?



It is time for our annual fall stewardship campaign. During this time we will talk about the good works and mission of our congregation. It is our hope that, as you reflect on this and think about what it is you love about Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, you will prayerfully consider your support for our church. Your support is vital to the ongoing and continued success of our congregation. We are asking that you give, not because you ought to. Give because you can. Give because you are able. Give because of your love for God and Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. We are doing good things here at Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. And with your support, we will continue to do good things for years to come.

Did you know?!? Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

If you are at least 70 ½ years old, there is an alternative way to give to your church or your favorite charity. This is called QCD. This is where you withdraw funds from your traditional IRA through your financial advisor and you are not taxed on the distribution of those funds. Check with your financial advisor, but, in most cases, you sign a form and put in a request with the dollar amount and name of the church or charity. A check is made out to the church or your charity and mailed to you for you to give to the church or charity. You can request this each time you want to give whether it be monthly, quarterly, yearly, etc. And, for those who are at least 73 years old, QCD's count toward the IRA owner's required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year. Just an option for us older folks and you won't be taxed on your withdrawal. Again, check with your financial advisor for more details.
