Notes From the Director of Music



O Come, O Come Emmanuel

The musical composition of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" plays a significant role in enhancing the themes of the upcoming Advent season. Here are several key aspects of its significance:

1. **Melodic Structure and Mood**

The hymn is traditionally set in a minor key, which contributes to its somber and reflective mood. This choice of tonality aligns with the themes of longing and anticipation prevalent during Advent. The minor key evokes a sense of yearning for hope and redemption, mirroring the spiritual longing for the coming of Christ.

2. **Repetitive Refrain**

Each verse of the hymn corresponds to different titles of Christ, reflecting various aspects of His identity — such as "Wisdom" and "Key of David." The musical composition complements these themes, allowing the congregation to meditate on the significance of each title while being enveloped in a hauntingly beautiful soundscape that enhances their emotional response.

5. **Encouragement of Reflection**

The hymn's pacing and musical dynamics encourage introspection. As worshippers engage with the lyrics and melody, they are invited to reflect on their own lives and the ways they, too, seek Emmanuel in their everyday experiences. This reflective quality aligns with the Advent focus on preparation and self-examination.

6. **Transition to Celebration**

Finally, the hymn serves as a poignant transition from the waiting of Advent to the celebration of Christmas. By singing "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," congregations acknowledge the tension of waiting while simultaneously looking forward to the joy that Christ's birth brings. This sets the stage for the joyful celebration of Christmas, making the eventual arrival of the Savior even more significant.

In summary, the musical composition of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" enriches the Advent experience by embodying themes of longing, hope, and reflection, creating a powerful atmosphere for worship during this sacred season.

NEWS FROM KATE'S KUPBOARD

Kate's Kupboard was open on October 18, 2025.

We helped **614** people by distributing **196** household/personal care bags, **170** produce boxes, **196** packs of meat and **330** bags of groceries. We helped **115** babies and provided adult care products to **32** people.

The total cost was \$5,002.86.

We helped a family of 3 who had no food by providing 5 bags of groceries and 2 household bags. We also helped one baby between our September and October Kate's Kupboard. We continue to help people through Neighborlypa.com


