

Letter from the Lead Pastor



Dear PCC Family,

As we reflect on this past ministry year, my heart is full of gratitude for the Lord's faithfulness among us. When we look back, we see more than a calendar of events; we see God's steady hand guiding, sustaining, and forming our church. He has met us in worship, shaped us through His Word, and drawn us into a hospitable community in ways only He can orchestrate.

One of the greatest joys we experienced this year was celebrating baptisms. Each story represented a life transformed by the grace of Jesus, a public declaration of faith, and a powerful reminder that the Gospel is still changing hearts here among us. These moments lifted our spirits and renewed our sense of mission, because every baptism is a sign that God is at work in our church in ways that surpass strategy and programs. It is His Spirit moving, drawing people to Himself, and awakening new faith.

This year also brought its share of challenges. We walked through significant staff health concerns and navigated an important staff transition. And throughout it all, He reminded us that His Church is not built on human effort alone but on the foundation of Jesus Christ.

I want to extend heartfelt thanks to every person who stepped forward to serve—those who took on new responsibilities, covered roles during staff absences, and faithfully supported our ministries week after week. Your willingness to stand in the gap embodied the heart of a servant, and God used your faithfulness to bless our church family and keep ministry moving forward.

As we look ahead, we do so with hope and expectancy. We are in a season of building-spiritually, relationally, and missionally-and we believe God is calling us to construct something that will last, not for our name, but for the name of Jesus. The work may be arduous at times, but it is sacred work. And we hold onto this encouragement from Scripture: "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labour in the Lord is not in vain." – 1 Corinthians 15:58.

May God continue to strengthen, unify, and empower us by His Spirit as we move forward together into all He has prepared for us.

We are also extremely pleased to share that PCC is now contributing 3% of the General Fund income to the Alliance Global Advancement Fund (GAF)—a significant step in strengthening our partnership with the global work of The Christian & Missionary Alliance in Canada.

Transformative justice is one of our core values at PCC, and this year we were grateful for the opportunity to live this out in a tangible way. A short-term mission team, led by Sarah Mast, travelled to Mount Currie to serve the local Indigenous communities. The team helped prepare the campgrounds so children and teens could gather and hear the Good News of Jesus at this year's summer camp, a meaningful expression of love, service, and reconciliation.

At the heart of our mission work is the conviction that God has always intended Christianity to be a movement. A movement of His people advancing the Gospel among unreached peoples and sharing the hope of Jesus with those in every generation, until the very end of the age. This vision inspires and propels everything we do.

As we look ahead, we hold fast to Jesus' call in Matthew 28:19: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations..." This remains the heartbeat of our mission efforts, both locally and globally.

As a team, we remain committed to praying for our missionaries and fostering deeper engagement within our church community. We look forward to another year of partnering together in God's mission, both near and far.

Life Together

Care Team

We launched a PCC Care Team in the Fall of 2024 to assist our pastoral team in extending shepherding care to our people who need support and intentional expressions of concern and prayer.

Events

Over the last calendar year, we have hosted nine (9) churchwide events to help people in our congregation develop and deepen connections. The events were: Family Fun Fair, Harvest Festival, Hymn Sing & Dessert Potluck, Multicultural Potluck, Christmas Carol & Dessert Night, Family Ice Skate, Springtime Family Walk at Campbell Valley, Volunteer VIP Reception, & Worship & BBQ Night.



We live out our lives together in Growth Groups by engaging in Bible studies, prayer, service, and support. In the 2024-2025 ministry year, we had eight (8) active growth groups.

Affinity & Demographic Groups

Our 55+ Group met for socials, hymn sings, and learning opportunities on numerous occasions.

Our men's group met for quarterly breakfasts and/or dinners to foster community and to be inspired by a message shared by an invited speaker.

Our women's group met for socials, Bible studies, and participated in a conference hosted by another church.

Our Young Adults group met for Saturday morning breakfasts.

Ministry Highlights

We began our ministry year with a Parent Equipping Night featuring Dawna-Lyn Broadhead, who spoke on "Raising Confident Children." It was a meaningful evening of practical encouragement for parents and grandparents.

Our Family Fun Fair kicked off the fall season with intergenerational worship, a message from Carmen Kinniburgh, and an afternoon of games and treats. Our Harvest Fest returned for its fourth year—complete with pumpkin carving, a mini petting zoo, and chilli lunch—bringing our church family and community together in celebration.

In October, we hosted our PCC Kids Volunteer Training, equipping our leaders to serve with confidence and care. Our volunteers continue to be the heartbeat of this ministry, faithfully loving and leading our children each week.

We welcomed Olivia Meerkerk as our PCC Ministries Intern and Maryam Amin Pour as our Summer Ministry Admin Support - supporting lesson planning, volunteer coordination, and helping our ministry continue to thrive through a year of transition.



Pacific Kids

Sunday Curriculum

Each Sunday, our Pacific Kids ministry uses The Gospel Project (by Lifeway) to help us dive into Scripture together in a meaningful and age-appropriate way. This curriculum is Christ-centred, meaning every story and lesson points back to Jesus and His redeeming work. It is chronological, so kids explore the Big Story of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation, helping them see how God's plan unfolds from start to finish. At the same time, it is age-aligned, allowing preschoolers, elementary kids, and Impact Kids to walk through the same passage each week, adapted to their level. The Gospel Project is also theologically rich and missionaly minded: kids are encouraged not just to hear the story, but to respond and live out the gospel in their everyday lives. The goal of this curriculum is transformation rooted in a relationship with Jesus, not just behaviour change.

Programs & Events

Our children led us in worship this past Christmas, joyfully singing two songs that reminded us of the wonder of Christ's birth.

Throughout the summer, our SPARK programs returned with energy and purpose:

- Girls Day "Loved & Lovely" focused on confidence and God's love.
- Boys Day "Strong & Brave" encouraged courage and compassion.
- Summer SPARK "Stronger Together" built teamwork and faith through games and service.
- Shine Bright Celebration wrapped up summer with glow-themed fun and family worship.

We also enjoyed monthly Sunday Sundaes—a simple but joyful way to connect as a church family after service.

Embodying the Gospel & Transformative Justice

24/7 Prayer

We held two 24/7 weeks of prayer as a congregation, one to begin 2025 with the theme "Foundations," and the other, a week before Holy Week, on the theme "Pure Gospel." During the week of prayer at the start of the year, we also fasted as a church for seven days.

PCC-U

We hosted 3 PCC-U courses! Arthur Tymos facilitated two "Gifted For Ministry" courses with 31 participants in total. We also invited David Wood and Mardi-Dolfo Smith to teach on "The Bible, Sex, and a Changing World." Approximately 45 people attended the course!

Potential New Venture Engagement

An East African Christian group has been meeting at PCC on Sunday afternoons for worship. We are currently discerning whether to integrate this fellowship more formally into PCC with the hope of launching it as a new venture church plant in our Alliance family of churches. Our discernment process has included:

 Relational Discernment
 A Hospitality Team from PCC has been attending their services to build relationships and foster connections.
 This has helped us listen, learn, and understand how God may be leading us together.

Refugee Sponsorship

Our church honoured the commitment we made to support Afghan refugee families transitioning to Canada through a partnership with Fleetwood Reformed Church. Contributing \$25K during a time of economic uncertainty, primarily through the giving of our people, was an act of faith, and God provided to be faithful as always!

Interfaith Dialogue

We invited members of the New
Westminster Sukh Sagar Sahib Gurdwara
to PCC for a dialogue to build relationships
between Christians and Sikhs. Sikh chaplain
Inderjeet Singh represented Sikhism, and
Isaac Munnalall represented Christianity.
After the discussion, we held a Q&A and
ended with snacks and an informal
conversation. This approach to Embodying
the Gospel at PCC was novel to us. About
35 people attended.

- Leadership Development
 Two key leaders from the group, Felix
 Musore and Patrick Ngoma, have been
 walking through the Alliance Canada's
 licensing pathway. We are pleased to
 share that both passed their verbal
 examinations, an encouraging step for
 future partnership possibilities.
- Where do things stand today? We see significant promise, but more discernment is needed regarding structure, alignment, and next steps. We want to move prayerfully, wisely, and at a healthy pace.
