FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

From the Pastor's Desk

I have a **LOT** of important topics to cover this month.

Christmas Eve Ornament

As I wrote last month, we plan to give every person who attends our Christmas Eve service an ornament related to our stained glass project. That way, even if someone did not win one of the auctions, every person can still be a part of this great project.

The ornaments are all made of epoxy and almost all of them have stained glass in them: either pieces, or chunks, or little shards. A very small number havewood in them from the old pews. Remember, this material came from the old church and is about 100 years old. Most of the ornaments are various shapes of crosses with a few other fun shaped thrown in (as shown in the photo).

On Christmas Eve we have two services: one at 6:30 pm and one at 11 pm. Between both services we average 350 or even 400 people. So join us!



Thank you for welcoming Associate Pastor Kathy McKinley into our church family. She has really hit the ground running and I'm so glad she is here to help out. Since I know her goal is to know everybody, let me remind you that it can take 6 months to a year for a pastor to feel like he or she really has a handle on names in a big new place. She has about 400 or morenames to learn, so thank you for your patience. I know there are times when I'm still struggling because we have so very many visitors who come to our church.

This is a great time to also remind you to please wear your nametags to church. Not only does it help you, but it greatly helps new folks to begin to learn the names of people who worship with them.

Medical Clinic Mission Project

The Medical Mission, supported by multiple churches in Crestview, that was scheduled for November was postponed. I heard that there was some kind of disappointing scheduling mix-up with the High School.

That Mission will be rescheduled for some time in the Spring of 2026. Listen out for more details for this important project.

Changes Coming

As a pastor, I try to avoid springing change on people. I have served some churches which had previous pastors who simply met with two or three people and made a major changes to the church without any preparation at all for the congregation. We want to avoid that.

So I wanted to tell you about a few changes that are happening. A few have started and more will come next year.

A. Crossroads Center Worship Decoration

This change already happened in November. We have installed mounts in the side walls so that we can hang worship banners. Previously, we could show two banners up front by the screens, but now we can display 6 more (three per side). This change will serve multiple

purposes. First, it will add color, spiritual messaging and inspiration to our worship. Further, it will add to the sound quality of the room by reducing echoing. We will be buying more worship banners in the future, and if you are interested in helping with this project, please let me know.

B. Main Sanctuary

We are slowly planning a few significant changes to the Main Sanctuary. Some are cosmetic, some are functional and structural. Our Trustees are in the middle of coming up with a plan for some structural changes. Here are some of the things we're considering and the problems we will try to address.

1. We will be adding the possibility of worship banners for special occasions which will be hung over the choir. You will see the



first usage on Christmas Eve. I believe these will be a beautiful addition.

- 2. We are planning on returning our main altar to its old usage. Because of the screen located at the back side of the altar, we are not able to place flowers arrangements, candles or a cross as in the past. We hope to return these in the future.
- 3. There is a proposal to relocate screens. We do not want to totally remove screens from the sanctuary. The current screen served a good purpose for a while. I think that the illustrations shown during the sermon are helpful for most people (and I put a lot of thought into what goes into my sermon with these). Furthermore, the screens are especially meaningful when we run slideshows of people's lives at funerals. Many people find these incredibly touching and we want to keep that functionality while not marring the distinctive looks of the front of our sanctuary.

The problem is not so much the screens but the location and the quality. The images are often very faded. And aside from requiring the top of the altar to be bare as described in #2, another problem is the air conditioner makes the screen wave and move. This is a little distracting in the sanctuary, but it can be very distracting online. The camera operators sometimes have to switch angles when the A/C comes on. I've also heard that it will be pleasant to remove the distracting sound the screen makes going up and down as well as the visual obstruction in front of the beautiful organ.

Therefore, we are exploring moving to TV screens to a location up top on the side up in the rafters. We already have two screens in that area now for the choir so they can see the sermon images and this would simply add two more which face the congregation. The screen sizes will be much smaller than the big single screen we currently have, but the images will be sharper and the colors more rich than the faded images were currently have.

4. The Stage Modification from several years ago is both helpful and has introduced some problems. It was helpful in adding a lot of space and that platform even held a praise band at one time. I remember when we became a Global Methodist Church, on that Sunday we had about 23 people join and they all came up on that stage. I confess that was great to see.

But when it comes to worship style, I think for the foreseeable future, we have settled into a routine and pattern for our church that traditional worship will generally happen in the main sanctuary and contemporary worship will generally happen in the Crossroads Center. So I don't envision a band on that stage in the future.

Furthermore (and more critically for me), I'm very concerned about the choke-point that our current stage created (I'm rather safety conscious). I have long felt that the corners of the stage are far too close to the wall and the space is totally inadequate for people to escape in an emergency. Only one person may pass at a time.

There are other consequences of our current design. We can no longer get a casket into the sanctuary from the doors at the drive-thru near the office because it is too tight.

Also, Communion and prayer have been affected. We currently cannot easily serve communion at the altar nor can we easily pray for someone at the altar.

Furthermore, for those of you who have a perfectionistic eye for symmetry, you already know that the center steps are not visually perfectly in line with the organ and the altar. A minor point, I admit, but noticeable to some (and I would be in that number).

Therefore, the Trustees are in the early stages of exploring reducing the stage size with a couple of possible goals. The first goals are just described: the ability to get behind the kneeling rail for communion and prayer, improved safety for emergency exits, and possibly the ability to move caskets from the drive-thru. We may not be able to achieve all of that, but this is what they are exploring.

But there is one more change which is related.

Pew locations.

Some of the above discussions all began with me a few months ago when I presented three problems to the trustees wishing that we could address them:

- a. side aisle is too narrow at the corners of the stage,
- b. zero handicap accessibility to the stage (this one is very hard and I'm not sure we can solve this right now), and pews that are too close together.

On this last point, I have noticed that our pews are not evenly distributed throughout. In some, the space between pews is adequate (more toward the front), while in some it is honestly terrible (more toward the back). Some are so close that it is impossible to move past someone. The solution is that we need more room and need more precise and consistent spacing between the pews.

One way to achieve this is to remove one pew per side- and honestly, that is not currently the most desirable solution for the trustees. It is still a possibility, but we think we really need the seating- especially as we continue to grow.

Another way to get more room is to reduce the stage. That is the solution being looked at right now. Also, we could remove the modesty rail up front. I like the modesty rail function and would hate to see it go, but very few sit on the very first row and reducing the stage and removing the modesty rail together might give us just the space we need to re-position the pews at a more desirable distance. Furthermore, neither the Chapel nor the Crossroads Center worship areas use a modestly rail.

Well, these are all big changes with a lot of things which will be affected and will need to be addressed, like: where puppets happen with the children, the handbell choir location, and the location of baptisms and weddings.

So please pray for the trustees and your pastor as we work through these issues. Decisions have to be made, and we might need to come up with some funding for this project since it will not be in the budget. We will not all agree on the changes, but I hope we can be supportive of the intent of the faithful work that is trying to be done.

When will these changes take place? The ones related to screens and high altar may happen soon. The structural changes will not happen until some time next year.
