#### Saturday, November 29<sup>th</sup>, 9 am - Noon

Expand your understanding and awareness of historical and present-day Indigenous peoples' lived experiences in Canada at the Kairos Blanket Exercise. The Blanket Exercise explores preand post-colonial contact with Indigenous peoples, in this case, the peoples of the lands of Treaty 7, and the historical relationship between Indigenous nations and non-Indigenous nations. The blankets laid out on the floor represent land, and the exercise allows participants to gain experiential knowledge about, and awareness of colonial expropriation of territories and diminishment of Indigenous culture. This awareness fosters compassionate understanding about historical and present- day Indigenous peoples' lived experiences of ongoing current injustices by colonial settlers and their descendants in Canada.

She has had life-long relationships with Indigenous people in Saskatoon, and has a deep understanding of their past and current day lives. Pattie Ann is a member of the Meeting Place Ministry team at High River United Church, which learns about, explores and takes actions toward truth and reconciliation. Pattie Ann helps to steer the conversations and plans of the team as it furthers congregants' understanding and awareness of history, as well as of present-day life experience of Indigenous peoples.

Isn't it nice to settle in after service and share some social time with your community of faith? Maybe catch up with someone you've been missing or chat with a friend?


Well, there's nothing better than enjoying that fellowship with food!

#### **PROFILE**

Swamini VishwaPratibha Maa was born in Calgary, Canada. After attaining a BSc. in Cellular and Microbial Biology, she realized it had taught her nothing about the true meaning of life, or God. The seeking began. It took her from Canada, to California, and finally to India. The first part of this journey is described in her memoir: "Inside the Wall: from Hollywood, to Homeless, to Higher Consciausness".

After thirty years on the path, she was initiated as a Sannyas of the Mahanirvani Akarda in India. After many trials, tests, and initiations, she was abruptly sent away from India, back to Calgary. Within months Paramahamsa Vishwananada flew to Canada and became her satguru. During her first visit to His ashram, Shree Peetha Nilaya, in Germany, she was immediately initiated as a Swamini in His monastic order.
