

Advent

Hello everyone. Are you ready? Next Sunday begins for us the season of Advent- the beginning of the church year. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." As Christians, Advent is a special time of preparation as we remember Jesus first coming into this world.

"Getting ready" is important. Much of our lives is spent preparing. We get ready for occasions and transitions in life. We prepare for exams at school. We prepare for job interviews, and for medical appointments. We ready ourselves for marriage and the arrival of children and ultimately for retirement.

Advent is about preparing for the most significant event in human history - the Incarnation. The Incarnation is God's "**breaking**" into human space. So, as followers of Jesus, the most important preparation that we will make during Advent, is creating space in our lives for Jesus. Perhaps, as we clean and decorate our homes, set up a tree and Christmas lights, this can be done with intentionality and meditation as we think of the reason why we do what we do!

Each Advent represents a new beginning. Therefore, it offers us another opportunity to begin anew. I invite you to commit yourself to the discipline of prayer in this sacred season. There are several different ways that we can express our intentionality. How so? 1. Through study of the Scriptures (our parish has three bible studies which meet each week), 2. Through corporate worship (There is Morning and Evening Prayer offered in the parish each day of the week, 3. Personal Devotional Time -spending time with God in prayer nourishes and informs our relationship with God.

During this upcoming season of Advent, I encourage you all to become more active and intentional in your faith in Jesus. Getting together to learn is a wonderful way to grow in our faith.

So friends, have a **contemplative Advent**. Emmanuel is with us! It is our delight to enter sacred space with Him. He will meet you there.
