A Christian ought to strive to:

I. The Pleasing Life (1-2)

please God,

II. The Pure Life (3-8)

live a <u>sanctified</u> life, which includes <u>sexual purity</u>,

III. The Proper Life (9-12)

and to <u>love</u> fellow believers while <u>living responsibly</u> among outsiders.

We <u>love</u>, because <u>He first loved</u> us. (<u>1 John 4:19</u>)

2. In 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8 Paul addresses an area of God's will that is of special concern. What is it?

What beliefs does Paul want the Thessalonians to have that are different from those in their culture? What reasons does he give for this?

What does sanctification mean? In thinking of sanctification, what are some specific areas of your life that come to mind?

3. What does Paul urge the Thessalonians to do in 1 Thessalonians 4:9-10 that he says they're already doing. How do they know how to do it?

What can make this so hard to do at times? What helps?

4. Paul addresses conduct among those outside the church in 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12. What does he tell them to do, and why?

What purpose would "proper behavior toward outsiders" serve? What does this look like in your life?

5. How does this passage reflect the need for exemplary love in God's people?
