ALL: We now honour, by holding in our hearts and uplifting in prayer, the victims of transphobic killings over the past year.

One: This list does not exist in a vacuum, nor is it possible to separate it from the intersecting violence faced by sex workers, people from a migrant or refugee background, Indigenous, Black and People of Colour, disabled people, neurodivergent people, people who use drugs, people who are HIV positive, and people living in poor socio-economic conditions, including those without safe housing. One: Where the body of a murdered trans person was found, but their identity could not be discovered, we will say "Name Unknown." In one case, we will say "Name Withheld" out of respect for the Indigenous Australian practice of not speaking the name of a loved one while their family is in mourning.
